

CITY COUNCIL GRIND.

Stallman and Bista Want to Build a Street Railroad to the Copper Plant.

ELECTRIC AND GAS FRANCHISES.

The City Pays the County \$7,212.50 and Now Ends the Sewer Extension Dispute.

The City Council met in regular session last night. In the absence of President Leffler, Mayor Morgan was called to the chair. The following members responded to roll call: Hales, Lawson, Hartsch, Hartsch, Evans, Kelley, Horn, Hardy, Follans.

THE PROCEEDINGS.

Frank Hartigan moved in a communication with reference to the thirty days extension recently granted by the Council to the Metropolitan Water Company, in which to submit their plan for extending the water main to the copper plant, and reported that the thirty days had expired and said that he was anxious to close up his contract and begin work.

Mayor Morgan asked to have the water main on the north end, saying he would pay extra for the water main taken therefrom. Committee on public grounds.

Frank Hartigan asked that the sum of \$10,000 paid by him for water main be refunded, as he had sold his own water main to the City Council. Board of public works.

Miller & Miller, real estate brokers, sent to a communication in which they stated they wished to erect a building on a part of lot 4, block 30, plat 1, but could not do so, owing to the fact that the water main and sewer lines diagonally through the ground. Therefore they asked permission to change the course of the main at their own expense. Committee on public grounds.

W. F. Williams offered to lease five acres and gravel beds belonging to the city and pay \$11 cents for each foot taken out. Committee on public grounds.

A. Bristow and others represented that they had paid water tax for laying main on Union avenue, and asked for the privilege of connecting with the general water system by service pipe, of that a main be laid on Union avenue. Committee on waterworks.

Leonard Lundstrom and thirty-two others asked for a water main to be laid on North street to the copper plant. Committee on waterworks.

Hallman & Lott asked for a franchise to construct a water main, beginning at the Warm Springs, to the west line of Kinsey's Copper Plant addition, and beginning at the intersection of Tenth and North streets, and North street to the intersection of Tenth and North streets, with the usual provisions. They also asked that immediate action be taken on the present methods of transportation between the corner of the city and the copper works, as entirely inadequate. Committee on waterworks.

Committee on waterworks reported that they had laid out the water main on North street, and that the city attorney assented.

The superintendent of sewers reported that they had laid out the sewer main on North street, and that the city attorney assented.

A. H. Hartsch asked that action be taken in the matter of water main on North street between Third and Fourth West streets. Committee on waterworks.

Mr. Hartsch's petition laid on the table earlier in the evening, was again taken up and referred to the board of public works.

WELL COMING IN.

Councilman Bell, who just returned from a business trip to Montana, advised the council chamber at this juncture of the proceedings and took his seat.

GREEN STREET WATERMAINS.

The committee on waterworks recommended that the petition of John Alcott et al asking that water main be laid on Green street be granted, and the collector and sewer be authorized to collect the balance of the assessment, and when such collection is made, that the superintendent of waterworks be authorized to lay the main. Adopted.

CHARLES WATTS LIGHT.

Thelma recorder reporting in the matter of the petition of James Houghton, asking for extension of sewer on Second West street, from Second North to Fifth North street, stated that he could not police the notice of intention until he was informed as to which side of the street the sewer was to be laid.

THAT OTHER SIDE.

The committee on claims reported on the sewer dispute between the city and county, found that \$2,650.00 was owing to the county and recommended that that amount be appropriated to the latter. Adopted.

MILTON'S TAXES.

The committee on claims reported on the petition of Charles Houghton for relief of taxes. Reported favorably.

MR. J. H. HARTIGAN.

The application for a franchise by H. M. Hartigan for water main from Big Cottonwood canyon, in this city was taken up and referred to the city attorney and committee on municipal affairs.

MR. HARTIGAN'S PLAN.

The gas and electric light franchise of Woodfill House was referred to the same committee.

MORGAN AND THE COUNCIL.

Morgan offered a resolution requiring that the city attorney begin the construction of the city's part of the water main in city creek canyon, and that the city engineer be directed to give the proper grade and set the necessary stakes at once.

THE HARTIGAN GUARANTEE.

On motion of Lawson, an ordinance presented on May 9th, providing that city engineers may be authorized to take the city's part of the water main, was taken up and read first time. Under a suspension of the rules the ordinance was read a second and third time but failed to pass for want of a majority vote of the whole Council. The vote stood seven for and four against.

ELWOOD'S ORDINANCE.

An ordinance levying the tax and for the same purpose of property on both sides of Fifth East street from Second North to Ninth North streets in district No. 2, for sidewalk construction, was passed.
