Mayor Bransford's criticism of the statement of the city's financial condition prepared by the minority members of the council, has submitted a statement of explanation. The minority statement was squelched by a hurried adjournment in the council last Monday evening, but attained publicity through the press. Mayor Bransford criticised the statement, and Mr. Hall's reply is

the press. Mayor Bransford criticised the statement, and Mr. Halt's reply is as follows: "He admite the first item of cash on hand Dec. 31, 1907, of \$7.088.94, is all right, but objects to the second item, \$160,344.65, uncollected taxes of 1907. Nov of this second item \$11,639.21 was paid to the city treasurer on Jan. 4, 1908. Suppose that had been paid four days sooner, or at the close of business on Dec. 31, 1907, as it might have been. Then the cash balance on hand would have been just that much greater, and this large portion of the second item would have been in the first item and, according to the mayor, would then have been all right and available for 1908. The same reasoning holds as 10 balance of the second item, and shows it to be all right as a, whole. The same reasons hold as to the flat water rates assessed prior to 1905. \$40,759.65. "The, these back taxes, water rates and cash on hand and much more had to be used to pay debta incurred in 1907, as shown in our statement of dis-bursements, as notice the items of the eity's portion of contracts made ptior to 1908, given as \$195,723.64, most of which was due Dec. 31, 1907, and has since been paid. Also notice item of depart-mental bills incurred in 1907 and paid in 1908, amounting to \$87,823.22. "As to what the mayor says about the meter and miscellaneous water re-ceipts being stated too high, I would say that the auditor's books show that for the first six months \$26,448.47 was collected, and we simply coubled that to get the amount given, \$52,596.94, for the year. "As to cur estimate on licenses be-ing too high because, as the mayor states, a number of the licenses paid in \$2,500, which would practically all oc-cur in the first six months of this year. "The cuditor's books show over \$106. 725,91 collected in the first six months of this year. This is \$12,500 less than it would bave been except for the new system of cellection, which the mayor mentions, requiling all licenses to ex-pic at the end of the calendar year, the last haif of as follows:

As to our estimate of departmental expenses being too low, we took the ex-penses for the half year ending June 30 and doubled them, and then added about \$25,000 for extra cost of running some departments for the last half of the year. One trouble with the esti-mate of the board of apportionment from which the mayor quotes, is that all unpaid bills of 1907, amounting to over \$\$7,000, as our statement shows, were added into the estimated expenses for 1908, and we find large amounts set 1908, and we find large amounts they do not need and are not using. The June bulletin of the state board of health has been published. It shows the total number of deaths in the state

14 deaths. It is instructive to compare these sta-tistics with those of the month of June for 1907, as showing a marked improve-ment, owing to the continued activities of the state board. Lost year, there were 283 deaths, with 73 districts re-porting no deaths, and 54 districts re-porting freedom from contagious dis-case. There is a heavy failing off in smallpox cases, the former record be-ing 35 cases as against 18 for June of this year: diphthetia, 55 cases; typhoid, 24 cases; whoopingcough, 273 cases; chickenpox, 34 cases.
