Chilian War News.

New York, 27.—The Panama  
Star and Herald, of July 16th, has  
the following: In the state of  
Chilian Admiral Riveros announced  
his intention to bombard Lima and  
the diplomatic body. The  
notification also conveys an intima-  
tion that the Pacific Steam Navigation  
Company's steamers would be  
permitted to enter Callao harbor up  
to the 5th inst., and receive for-  
eign families who desired to leave  
the city. The Admiral has already  
threatened that Lima "when taken  
will be given up to destruction and  
the ravages of the Chilian troops as  
were Mollendo and Arica because,  
as he states, the Chilian officers  
cannot restrain their men." The  
Peruvians are preparing to re-  
turn their women, children and house-  
hold valuables a place of refuge at  
Tarma, situated beyond the im-  
penetrable ramparts of the Cordillera.  
President Bolognesi has decreed that  
every man between 16 and 60 years of age,  
excepting the clergy and medical  
profession and a few employees of the  
government offices, shall present  
himself in uniform and drill every  
day from 7 till 11. To enable men  
to do this, all places of business will  
be closed from 10 till 12. Those who  
do not comply with the order will  
be sent to join the active army. All  
foreigners are invited to form a corps  
to maintain order and protect prop-  
erty in the event of the city being  
left at any time without the usual  
guardians of the peace. No in-  
habitant of the province of Lima is  
allowed to pass beyond its limits  
without a passport. The Archbishop  
of Lima has placed the treasure of  
the church at the disposal of the  
government to be used in the ser-  
vice of the country.

The Chilian government is said to  
have agreed upon the following prop-  
ositions looking to the prosecution  
of the war.

First.—To issue \$5,000,000 for the  
continuance of the war.

Second.—To organize an army with  
new divisions.

Third.—To raise the Manco Capac.  
Serious debate was occasioned in  
Congress in consequence of Deputy  
Munoz's proposal to raise the Manco  
Capac to fight through the mediation  
of another power, and that the bom-  
bardment of Callao was a "barbarous  
and useless proceeding."

The law of 1877 banishing certain  
bishops from Colombia on the charge  
of being implicated in political in-  
trigues, is revoked.

The volcano Fuego, in Gatemala,  
is in exceedingly active condition.  
At San Benito and even beyond that  
point in Mexico and down the San  
Salvador coast, the fire and dust  
threw up by the volcano fills in  
quantities which render it certain  
that in the immediate neighborhood  
the effect must be calamitous.

Joseph Eres, alias Hoffman, an  
American resident in Aspinwall and  
claiming to be a merchant, was re-  
sented on the charge of putting into  
circulation counterfeit greenbacks of  
the United States. He was sent to  
liberty on "straw bail," the judge  
saying, "It is openly said, being  
bought over. The Superior Court  
telegraphed to have him arrested."  
Eres figured prominently in the  
Brooklyn papers in 1877, when his  
wheels were stalled at some \$50,000.

**Labor League and Hancock.**  
The Herald narrates an interview  
yesterday between a committee  
from the United States Labor  
League and Hancock, Gen. Mc-  
Bride, of Virginia, was spokesman  
for the committee. He said both  
concerns and republicans "belonged  
to their organization," and "expressed  
local influence in many sections,"  
that in September next they would  
hold a convention in this city, at  
which they would decide the ques-  
tion as to why the candidate  
they would support—a decision that  
could only be reached by first ascer-  
taining which of the candidates was  
most in accordance with their views.

He pointed out the whole organiza-  
tion had any connection with Socialism  
or Communism. Their sole object  
was to secure justice to the working  
classes, an enforcement of the rights  
of labor, and the establishment of a  
system of arbitration between em-  
ployees and workmen to prevent  
strikes, and the enactment of laws  
tending to more justly award the  
division of product between capital  
and labor. After listening to the  
statements of the committee, Hancock  
refused to express any views on  
the matter. Under the circumstances,  
he declined to do so, and he cheer-  
fully did so to give them a  
letter of introduction to Senator Bar-  
num, chairman of the Democratic  
National committee. The latter  
said a formal one and said that the  
gentlemen would explain their busi-  
ness.
