Broke Record in Five Mile Race on Saucer Last Night.

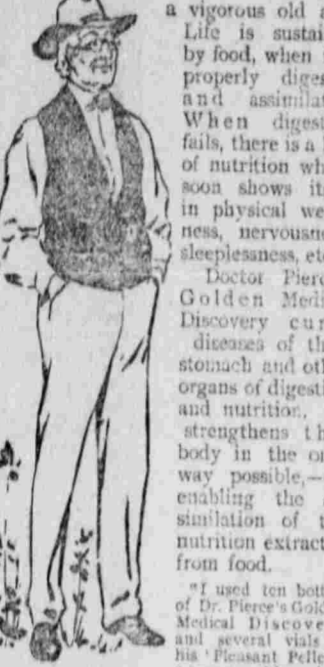
CHAPMAN'S MOTOR RAN WELL

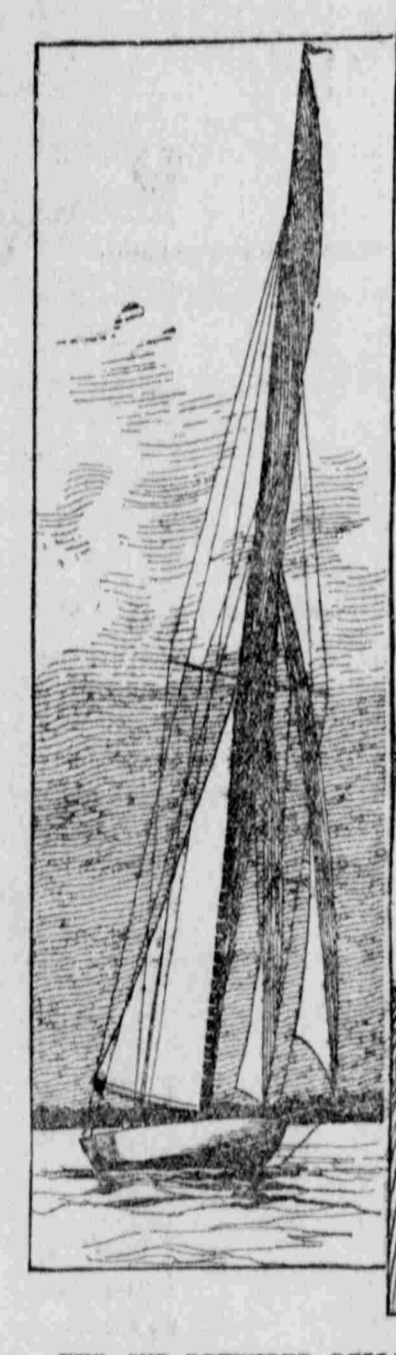
