HARNESSING THE COLORADO.

Its Energy is to be Transmitted to Los Augeles.

secure a new spring waist at a reduced price. Los Angeles, Cal., Feb. 22.—Accord-ing to the Times, the energy of the Colorado river is to be transmitted to Saturday Only 98c.

Ing to the Times, the energy of the Colorado river is to be transmitted to Los Angeles, according to plans now being matured by local and Philadel-phia capitalists. First, the power is to be distributed among the mining camps on the Nevada and Arizona border and ultimately brought here. It is claimed that between the Grand Canyon of the Colorado and the Black canyon it is possible to take advantage of certain sites and develop 500,000 horse power. After an inves-tigation of other electrically trans-mitted power plants in the state, the waters of the Black canyon were filed upon over a month ago to the extent of 250,000 miners' inches, by William Carruthers and John Campbell. Plans are now being prepared for a concrete dam 200 feet high. The dam is to be constructed at the lower end of the canyon and with the tall thus obtain-ed it is calculated that 110,000 horse power will be developed at the mini-mum flow.
