A SENSIBLE MOVE.

The Liberals of the Junction City are
disbanding.

During the present week a great
change has taken place in the most
strong and powerful Liberal party in
the Junction city. Most of the work
of the party left, and assisted in
the organization of the Republicans
and Democratic parties mentioned.
Others still remain, but have
now withdrawn from the party.
John H. Brown, president, has
now joined the Republicans. The late
Mark A. Bates, W. T. Kelly and a number of prominent
Liberals have become members in
yesterday's News, a stamping
bowed.

Yesterday Charles Hays, the general
superintendent, brought the slaves of the
chief workers on his internal
committee, giving as an excuse for
the move that the mission of the
party was accomplished. He now
says up to date.

Committee A. J. Bates of the Third
ward, after long and careful study of
the matter, announced his resignation
in sympathy with Republican principles,
and that he would now not
be a member of the party.

In the evening a meeting was held
in the mayor's office and the following
was passed without a dissent:

To the Liberator's of Ogden city
and West county.

"As a meeting of Liberal voters held
last evening, at which the Liberal
central committee was having its
annual meeting, it was decided to
make a dissolution of the party
at this meeting. Five members of
the central committee were present,
and it is assumed to be representative
to the mass meetings, to the
understanding reached in
yesterday's News, that
they intended to leave the party
in favor of the Republicans.

"In view of the great change
which is taking place in
the Territory of Utah, and especially in
Ogden City, West county, we
nearly believe that it is good politics
good judgment and for the best interest
of the Territory that the Liberal
party should now disband, and
the present at least affiliate with
the national political party to which
they naturally turn.

"In rendering this judgment we
have had in mind the welfare of
both the country and the party.
We have been greatly gratified by
this meeting. Five members of
the central committee were present,
and it is assumed to be representative
to the mass meetings, to the
understanding reached in
yesterday's News, that
they intended to leave the party
in favor of the Republicans.
