THE following rection of an act of Congress is cublished for the information of all whom it may con-

"Sec 9. And be it further enacted, That every person. not subject to the rules and articles of war, who shall procure or entice, or attempt to procure or entice, a soldier in the service of the United States to desert; or who shall harbor, conceal, or give employment to a deserter, or earry him away, or aid in carrying him away, knowing him to be such; or who shall purchase from any soldier his arms, equipments, simmonition, un form, the United States and Foreign Countries. In this bustclothing, or any part thereof; and any Captain or commanding officer of any ship or vessel, or any superintendent or conductor of any railroad, or any other public cor veyance, carrying away any such soldier, as one of his crew or otherwise, knowing him to have deserted, or of any description, purchased and freighted to this shall refuse to deliver him up to the orders of his commanding officer, shall, upon legal conviction by flued, at the discretion of any Court having cognizance of the same, in any sum not exceeding \$500, and he shall be under the name of "Gilbert & Gerrish," has this day imprisoned not exceeding two years nor less than six months.".
