## MILITARY NOTICE.

## HEAD QUARTERS DIST. OF UTAH,

CAMP DOUGLAS, U. T.

March 17th, 1863.

THE following section of an act of Congress is published for the information of all whom it may concern:

"Sec 9. And be it further enacted, That every person, not subject to the rules and articles of war, who shall procure or entice, or attempt to procure or entice, a soldier in the service of the United States to desert; or who shall harbor, conceal, or give employment to a deserter, or carry him away, or aid in carrying him away, knowing him to be such; or who shall purchase from any soldier his arms, equipments, ammunition, uniform, clothing, or any part thereof; or any Captain or commanding officer of any ship or vessel, or any superintendent or conductor of any railroad, or any other public conveyance, carrying away any such soldier, as one of his crew or otherwise, knowing him to have deserted, or shall refuse to deliver him up to the orders of his commanding officer, shall, upon legal conviction be fined, at the discretion of any Court having cognizance of the same, in any sum not exceeding \$500, and he shall be imprisoned not exceeding two years nor less than six months."
