Snashes Every Mark from Fifteen to Fifty Miles.

Fresno, Cal., Dec. 13.—Barney Oldfield mashed every automobile record from fit-teen miles to fifty on the Fresno fair grounds race track this afternoon. In 48 miles, 38.1-5 seconds he tore round the mile oval fifty times, reducing the world's record of 55:42 for fifty miles, held by Charles Gornt, by seven minutes and two and four-fifth seconds. The record for every mile under the fifty to fifteen was broken.
