WASHINGTON, 15.—Investigation
discloses the fact that there are
two thousand cases of fever in dif-
ferent forms, varying from light
fever to malignant typhoid. Physi-
cians assert the condition of
Cove Basin and the river the cause.

Several of the smaller cities show
healthy gains. The *Wells* says of
these figures: While the aggregate is
remotely large and contrasts favor-
ably even in the comparison
of a week of great activity last
year, it cannot be said that the
statement indicates a healthy state
of business. There is altogether too
much speculative fever for financial
stability. It does not matter what
the disease breaks out in the petro-
leum, cotton, grain or stock markets;
it is the same mischief, and does
much the same mischief. It is
clearly not a good thing that there
should be sold in one week more
than one-half the quantity of
petroleum than had ever been pro-
duced in the 24 years since oil wells
were opened.

The Western Union.
Negotiations which have been
pending for several months between
the Western Associated Press and
