MRS. CARR ARRESTED

Suspected of Complicity in the Murder of Her Husband.

THE BUNNELL THEORY SHAKES.

The Crisis Supposedly Has Been Com-mitted to Obtain a \$15,000 Reward.

DISMISSAL. Feb. 5.—Mrs. Carr, wife of Harvey L. Carr, the attorney murdered at his home Sunday night by his step-brother, was arrested this afternoon, charged with complicity in the crime. George Thorpe, Jim Tracy, a son, and Tel. Driven, friends of Mrs. Carr, were also taken into custody.

The theory upon which the arrests were made is that these people entered into the conspiracy to make away with Carr, or for the better securing possession of his life insurance, said to amount to \$20,000. Mrs. Carr shortly maintained that her husband was killed by burglars.

Carr was one of the most prominent lawyers in the city, but his life has been very quiet and uneventful. He came here from Baltimore several years ago, where he left a wife and two children. He obtained a divorce here. His second wife, a widow, is about 50 years old, and has a half interest in a house and lot on a hill overlooking the city, making the hours of her idleness, Mrs. Carr, the residence where she and Tracy and others.

MEETING OF WOOL GROWERS.

This Day Devoted to a Formal Hearing by a Senate Committee.

WASHINGON, Feb. 6.—A meeting of the National Wool Growers' association, called to attend to the welfare and promotion of the Wilson tariff bill, began this morning. Immediately after the opening in the meeting a committee was appointed to draw up a petition addressed to the finance committee of the Senate, asking for a hearing on the wool schedule of the tariff bill. A recent vote has taken, passing the report of the committee. This will be followed by a formal presentation of the association's position.

In reply to the position of the association, the committee had determined to grow a certain percentage of greater rams in the movement and it would be possible to make a large increase in the value of the product. It is expected that the association would be satisfied.

The members will remain in the city for a week or more and will probably endeavor to influence the Senate personally, being desirous of a formal hearing.

DOMINATED BY A GAS EXPLOSION.

INDIANAPOLIS, Feb. 7.—At one o'clock this (Wednesday) morning the building at the corner of Vinton street and Madison avenue, was totally demolished by a natural gas explosion. It is supposed the gas had accumulated in the cellar and finding its way through the pipes ignited at the gas meter.

The building was owned by Louis Koebler, who, with his wife and four children, occupied the upper portion of the house, and below was a saloon.

At the time the disaster had taken place, Louis Koebler, son, was out and the resulting fire fatally injured.

BLAND AND EASTLICK.

WASHINGTON, D. C., Feb. 6.—Secretary Fisher, accompanied by Representatives Bland, appeared before the House committee on judiciary today. They had just issued their respective reports, and Mr. Bland was going to the Capitol. Carlisle accompanied him, for the purpose of testifying against the bill. This talk brought out the fact that the secretary was not circumstantially opposed to the calling of the adjournment, although he did not approve some propositions in the Bland bill, which provided silver exchange to be issued.
