of the community cedes or surrenders a portion of his individual or natural rights for the benefit of the community, hence laws are framed and administered for the protection of the weak and powerless against the aggressions of the strong and oppressive. It follows then that such a man, tho

gressions of the strong and oppressive. It follows then that such a man, tho' he may enjoy such protection with all its rights and privileges, is not worthy of it, having contributed nothing to its support. No reasonable person could expect to be relieved from, and no right thinking person could object to, his portion of tax.

So it is with the kingdom and government of God on the earth. Tithing is the source of revenue in His kingdom upon a similar principle and for similar purposes as taxation in other governments of the earth, which the Lord seems to have adopted—both in ancient and modern times. Tithing is a tax on the income, and whenever God has had a people on the earth, who would abide the least of His laws, this one has been in force. Hence He said, speaking to His people through Joseph Smith the Prophet of the last days: "One tenth of all their interest anually." This He required, and goes on to say that they should observe this law "or they shall not be found worthy to abide among you." See Doctrine and Covenants, sec. 119.

It is very evident that whoever professes to be a citizen or subject of the

lt is very evident that whoever pro-fesses to be a citizen or subject of the Klugdom of God, on the earth, is in honor bound to observe this law, or forfeit its priveleges and blessings. While the giving of tithings and offer-While the giving of tithings and offerings is strictly optional with the people or doners. Now from my experience and observation (independent of the law) I know of no better way to "lay up treasures in heaven, where moth and rust doth not corrupt, northleves break through and steal." He who expects to go where the keeping of the law leads to, in the eternal future, must keep the law, or not go there, but will find some other place. The keeping of the law involves as much care and precision in its way as the strictest principle of taxation, or the debt and credit system of merchandizing manu-

credit system of merchandizing manu-facturing or any other well organized business system.

A HANGMAN'S QUESTION. PENDED PERSON INDICATE
SUPPERING! The opinion was recently expressed by a physician that a person struggling after being hanged would suffer just as long as the struggle continued. Doctors differ. Dr. Biothardt is of the opposite opinion. "As soen," said he, "as the pressure takes place upon the trachea and the blood vessels of the neck, there is congestion of the brain, followed by congestion of the lungs, and insensibility and cessation of respiration immediately ensue. "Will he kick or struggle while in that condition of unconsciousness?"

"That depends on the muscular action. If the spinal cord is ruptured during the fail, the jerking that takes place by the body falling and stretching the cord—usually called a fracture of the spine—is followed by paralysis of the entire body, in which case there would be no struggling. That is how the man ought to be hanged. But as to cases in which struggling of the body occurs that is mere nervous twitching. In the battle of Lexington I saw a man shot with a large ball in the skull which was blown right off. He ran for a distance of 250 and 300 yards towards the field hospital and then feil. He must have been dead before, or soon after he began to run; but at the moment of being struck he had immed around toward the hospital, and the idea of getting there being the last in his mind, had caused his body to take a bee line toward it. Hanging is the same kind of death as drowning. Many people have been taken out of the water who, when restored, recollected nothing that happened after they fell in. There have been cases too, of men hanging themselves, and remaining unconscious for hours, who, after having been reinvigorated, did not remember anything subsequent to the affixing of the rope or handker-chief."

"But if the rope should be so clumsily fixed as to miss the larynx and slip too near the edge of the chin?"

"Then the person would probably die by suffecation of the lungs, and congestion of the brain would take place anyway."

"And if the rope be placed under or over the larynx, so as to leave no space between itself and the neck, and the knot is fixed in the proper place under the ear, no pain is felt by the suspended individual after the drop has fallen, whether he kicks, moves, struggles or remains perfertly motion-less?"

"None whatever."—Chicago Journal.
