

is much less disposed to mildew than that variety. Its flavor is very sweet, making it a valuable market grape. It will endure more unfair treatment and continue to produce very good crops longer than any other grape of tolerable quality.

These six valuable varieties are really all the Utah cultivators want, to give them fresh fruit for the market and for the table, raisins for their cakes and pies, and for commerce, wine to drink and to sell, and these they may have in overflowing abundance. These plants will tap the wine fountains of our sunny vales, that are bursting with life, strength and stomachic health. They will flourish and bear abundant crops in all our settlements from Bear Lake in the north to the Muddy in the south.

In my next letter, I will treat upon the proper choice of plants to secure vigorous, strong-constituted vines. This is one of the chief elements of success. I would not advise extensive purchases of the above highly recommended varieties until properly tested in Utah; although I consider their reported character to be such as to justify a limited expenditure, and a thorough trial.

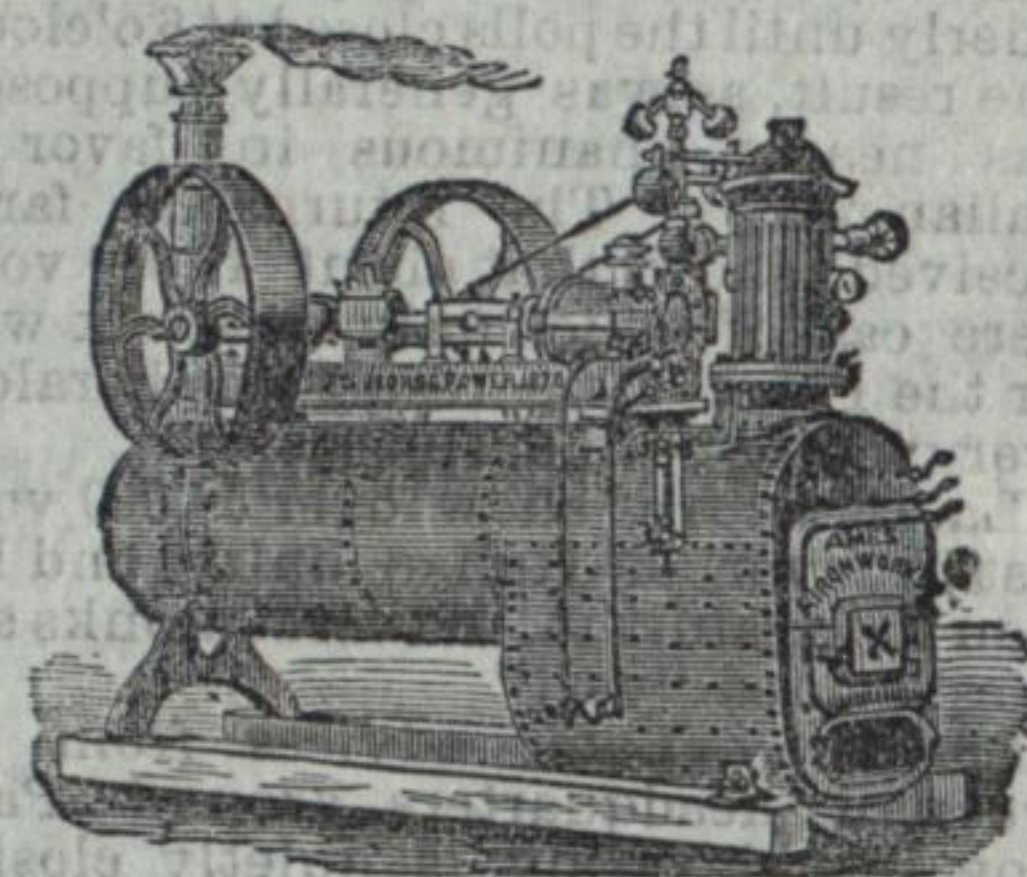
