HELD FOR MURDER.

Harriet Butler, Alvin Mitchell and John Rice.

HEARING SET FOR THURSDAY.

Verdict returned by the jury after the longest Saturday evening.

The inquest over the body of Fred Butler resulted in three persons being held for murder. They were Harriet Butler, wife of the murdered man, Alvin Mitchell, her son-in-law and John Rice. After the evidence was all in, the jury had about fifteen minutes to return the verdict. The three persons held were taken to the county jail to await a preliminary examination before Judge Wenger on Thursday next.

When the jurors retired closed on Saturday Mr. Butler had been placed on the stand. As before stated, he was the first to testify, but on being told that she could be excused on the ground that her evidence would tend to incriminate herself, she changed her mind, and the examination proceeded. In answer to questions she said that John Rice came to her at Murray where Mr. Butler lived, saying that a friend of his had some umbrellas there he wanted to get. She after wards said she did not know whether he had the umbrellas were there or whether he wanted to take them there to be mended. She told Rice she did not know where Butler lived, and asked him what he was doing in Murray, and he said he was collecting some money. She described to him the expression on his face, thought he was up to something, and said he could probably tell him where he lived. Through Rice's questions, "Yes, I know the man," she said.
