WASHINGTON, 27.—A warrant

Gen. H. G. Wright, chief of engi-

neers, United States Army, in his

annual report gives a detailed ac-

count of the condition and needs of

says the defenses of the United

States against a maritime attack for

many years must depend upon the

finishing of the Barbette batteries,

designed long ago, but which have

not been completed. It is with

The Last Sheep.

BOSTON, 27.—Rev. Henry Ward

Beecher, invited by the Traveler

to express his views of the criticism of

various ministers of New England

upon his withdrawal from the Con-

gregational body, writes the follow-

ing letter:

Brooklyn, N. Y.,

October 20th, 1882.

My Dear Sir—I thank you for let-

ters and papers. I have read some

what I call the expressions in re-

gard to my orthodoxy, consistency,

influence and general merit, with-

out wishing for a moment to reply,

as you kindly request me. When I

read what is lying on the dissecting

table under the hands of experts, it

would be unbecoming in him to rise

up suddenly and discuss with his

surgeons the propriety of their

method, and the truth of the re-

sults. 'Tis not often one can see

himself as others see

him, and especially as Boston-

ians to see him as they see him. I

am reduced to pulp, but thank heav-

en to ashes. When you suggest a

reply to these I am sure you can

have no conception of the subdued

and enlightened state of my mind.

I am bent on improvement, aside

from the laying aside of all my old
