THROWN FROM A STREET CAR.

Mr. J. H. Bennett Meets with a Serious Accident.

Mr. J. H. Bennett, former passenger agent of the Rio Grande Western, met with an accident last evening, which will incapacitate him for some time for a few days at least.

He was riding on the rear platform of a Rapid Transit car, when it suddenly stopped, and he was thrown from the car, and struck his head, throwing the gentleman off, face forward, from which he sustained numerous painful cuts and bruises. Mr. Bennett was rendered unconscious by the force of the fall, and it was some time before he recovered, receiving treatment at the hands of Dr. Tinsell, who is regarded as a successful medical expert, and inserted life, both of which were successful. The gentleman's injuries consisted of a bad bruise on the temple, cut on the left hand, and a severe lacerated hemorrhage.

WANTS A DIVORCE.
