Business was transacted in Judge Smith's court as follows:
Ryann Beasly, convicted of rape, was sentenced to five years in the penitentiary. His attorney, W. H. King, claims to have discovered new evidence, and an appeal will move for a new trial.

Wally Owens, secretary of the Savings & Investment Co. of Utah, withdrew his former plea of not guilty to a violation of the latter section of the U. S. postal laws, and entered one of guilty. In view of defendant's good character, and the fact that the case was a violation of the law, the court merely inflicted a nominal fine of \$5.

In the case of J. W. Hensley vs. H. H. Sparks and Reed & Dryden, the jury returned a verdict of \$250 for libel.

The case of Andrew N. Ferguson et al vs. Equitable Life Insurance Co. was tried, and a verdict of \$27 for plaintiff returned. The suit was brought to recover the amount stated on the ground that the insurance policy of Mr. Ferguson and his wife were several months late in being delivered. The suit seems to have been with Harry Timmons, an agent of the insurance company, in connection with making income.

The basis of Fred Peterson, Peter Peterson, William E. Peterson, Fred Leach and James M. Martin, who should have appeared for arraignment, were ordered adjourned, and bench warrants issued.
