First District Court. Justice was transacted in Judge Smith's court as follows: Byron Beasler, convicted of rape, was sentenced to five years in the penitentiary. His attorney, W. H. King, claims to have discovered new evidence, and an appeal will move for a new trial.

Walter Owens, secretary of the Savings & Investment Co. of Utah, withdrew his former plea of not guilty to a violation of the latter section of the U. S. postal laws, and entered one of guilty. In view of defendant's good character, and it appearing that the facts in this violation of the law, the court merely inflicted a nominal fine of \$5.

In the case of J. W. Hensley vs. H. H. Sparks and Reed & Orin, the jury returned a verdict of \$250 for libel.

The case of Andrew N. Ferguson et al vs Equitable Life Insurance Co was tried, and a verdict of \$27 for libel was returned. The suit was brought to recover the amount stated on the ground that the insurance policies of Mr. Ferguson and his estate were several months late in being delivered. The suit seems to have been with Harry Timmons, an agent of the insurance company, in an attempt to make a return.

The basis of Fred Peterson, Peter Peterson, William E. Pendergast, Fred Leach and James M. Martin, who should have appeared for settlement, was ordered adjourned, and bench warrants issued.

Notes. Leslie Bishop, a colored tramp who had infected the city several days, was ordered by Marshal Knight on Saturday afternoon for addressing himself to a passing lady, taken before Justice Wedgewood and sent up for ten days.

The Week in the Park. The week at the Park has been extremely quiet, and not much going on of any kind. The storm has passed and the snow is rapidly disappearing under the hot rays of the sun. The lower part of town is being rapidly filled up with water, and if the drainage is not looked after immediately, serious damage is likely to occur from overflow.

In Mine and Mill.

The mines and mills have been running since very peculiar circumstances lately an account of the uncertain prices of lead and silver, and many rumors are afloat as to the possible changes of most of the works situated down hill, something extra is shown in the way of the prices of the metals.

The Anchor company have informed their men that it will be necessary to cut wages again about 25 cents per week, if the mine keeps running. If the mine ceases to accept this cut the mine will keep working, otherwise the management says it will have to shut down. The mine owners claim that if silver reaches two or three cents lower than at present the mine will have to shut down. Altogether, times are not very bright here from a mining standpoint.

The Masons has made during the week two shipments of furniture or 25 boxes containing about 25,000 of the various of silver. The mill is running in preference to keeping open at work.

The new 5-stamp mill of Varson & Co. on the creek below the Cassara sawmill started on the week, and so far has developed to the extent that they will have a good thing in the enterprise if they can continue at work.
