NEW YORK.

Reformed Democratic Organization—

Cholera and Small Pox—Violent Gales—

Anxiety about the Russian Fleet—

Stocks, &c.

NEW YORK, 14.—It has been deter-

mined to make the Apollo Hall Demo-

cratic Reform Organization, under

whose auspices the late campaign was

principally conducted, the leading in-

stitution of the Democracy of New

York. In the new organization all the

political elements of the Democracy

will be embodied. Those who have been

prominent in connection with Tam-

many, however, will be excluded from

membership. Since the election the

honest men are fast leaving Tam-

many, whose power seems to be com-

pletely overthrown. It is understood

that Samuel G. Courtney will be chair-

man of the committee of the new or-

ganization. The reform leaders are re-

ceiving hundreds of communications

from prominent Democrats in the west

and in the interior of the State, urging

the formation of the new organization

and a reform basis, rejecting in the down-

fall of corrupt Tammany.

lative to the small-pox, though only

eight new cases have occurred in the

whole city since Saturday.

LOUISVILLE, 14.—Last night the citi-
