Accidents.

LOGAN, Utah, Sept 27th.

At Smithfield, Sept. 25th, Thos. William Thompson, while feeding a threshing machine, got his left hand in the cylinder, mauling it in such a manner that Dr. Ormsby, Jr., of Logan, found it necessary to amputate about three inches above the wrist. The same day, in Logan, Hans Munk, while attempting to extinguish a fire, near the feed box, slipped on the feed table, and one foot was carried into the cylinder, mauling and mangling the leg to the knee, in such a fearful manner, that Dr. Ormsby Jr., who was called to attend, found it necessary to amputate the limb, some four inches above the knee; this operation was performed about eight o'clock at night. Both cases are doing well at present.
