They are Minnie St. Clair. Chairles Smith, W. S. Martin, known as the Kansas City "Kid," Besaie Beam and Hazel Rays, alias Hazel Reed. The parties were arrested by the sheriff and chief of police at the home of Minnie St. Clair. The evidence against them is very strong. Minnie St. Clair formsely ran a notorious bawdy house in this city, while all the rest have police records. The prison-ers are being put through a rigid cross-examination, and a confession is expected in a few hours.
