DISCOURSE BY ELDER O. HYDE.

DEAR BRETHREN AND SISTERS:-

I am highly pleased with the privilege I now enjoy of speaking to you. I wish to call your attention to a subject which, to me, is of vast importance, and no less so to you. Just ten years ago that very day, when the pioneers first entered the valley, brother Brigham said, in view of the injustice and cruelty inflicted upon us by our enemies, 'It the United States will now let this people alone for ten years to come, we will ask no odds of them or any one else but God.'
