SAN DIEGO'S CORRUPT COUNCILS

Killed over a Game of Dice—A City in Darkness—Its Eyes Open a Vault.

Agricultural Colleges and Schools.

According to the United States department of agriculture's report, there are 37 institutions of learning having courses in agriculture. Several of the southern states have separate institutions for colored students. These institutions had 2,947 students in agricultural courses and 229 graduates from such courses in 1894. The total number of agricultural graduates, including 1893, was 6,000. Thirty-six of these institutions offer courses shorter than the usual one of four years, some being only a few weeks. In very few cases are courses completed in less time than six months. In addition to their regular studies, as applied to agricultural education in these institutions, many of them give instruction in other branches, as to the case of state universities, in the case of individual colleges, however. There were no experimental stations, with an income from all sources of about \$1,000,000 for the year, and with 502 persons on their working staffs, not counting voluntary laborers. Many of the members of the various clubs also give instruction in the agricultural colleges, with whom the students are associated in joint states.


