A Great Commercial Institution Pays Its Quarterly Dividend Tomorrow.

\$27,000 GOES TO STOCKHOLDERS.

**Gold Bar from Bingham—Cousack Slfers' Wages—Laid Offices and Other Items.**

**Tomorrow is divided day for the greatest commercial institution in the section of the country. Zion's Cooperative Mercantile Institution will pay over to its stockholders the dividend for the quarter just ended. The amount of cash which thus comes to the owners of shares in the institution is \$27,000, being a dividend of \$1 per cent for three months or \$2.50 per share.**

**Home, Utah.** *Miners.* The Mountain Queen mill, at Pionner, shows what can be done with low grade ore when there is no management and a good deal of luck. The average yield of gold per ton for free and yellow gold property leaves that is yielding splendid dividends to the owners, a Boston company. The mill, which is a 25-stamp, crushes an average of 90 tons per hour, and the product of the mill consists of gold to the value of \$10,000. He now has a partner in the Cornish pattern that will answer for the purpose of sinking 300 feet deeper. He will soon resume crushing, when he expects to increase the force of miners to 150 men. The King Tree mine, which was worked during the early history of Gold country and afterwards abandoned, within the course of 6 months it will give employment to a large number of men, and will be of great benefit to the community.

A Goldfield, Cal., digger says he has found a vein of gold-bearing gravel, near the deposit, gold has been discovered, which is five and six cents to the pan, being obtained.

It is a new discovery in the gravel deposit on which the last work was done, and is located on an elevation among all others now in the fruit-growing business. It is not a new discovery in the vicinity. Gold has long been known to exist in the gravel deposits on the Luce and the two miles of Headings, on the two miles of
