

Carriages were summoned, and while the police heat back the crowd with their batons, Chinique and his friends entered then and rapidly drove of. 



READING, Pa., 6.—The dynamite works of H. W. Stump & Co., three-quarters of a mile from Stouchburg, a village of five hundred inhabitants, blew up this afternoon, shaking up the country for a distance of twenty miles. The works consisted of five frame buildings, the timbers of which were sent flying in all directions, nothing remaining but the foundations. All the men in the buildings were killed, so the cause of the explosion can never be known. The names of the killed are Frank Stalz, married, aged 30; Frank Kapp, single, aged 21, and Jos. Kraus, single, aged 25. Windows were broken in manyhouses in Stouchburg, people knocked off their feet and mirrors and pictures shaken from the walls. A church and several houses were unroofed. The victims were literally blown to atoms.

At Robesonia, 10 miles from Stanchburg, a number of masons were working at the bottom of Ferguson & Co.'s furnace stack, relining it with fire brick. The stack was probably 100 feet high, and the work nearly completed. Ten, some say fifteen, men were in the stack, some at the bottom and others on scaffolding above. Just as the shock of the explosion was felt the stack quivered, there was a rumbling noise, followed immediately by a great deluge of bricks, completely burying six men wt the bottom of the stack.
