SUPREME COURT.

AN Unimportant Session.—General Matters in the Lower Branches of Justice.

When the Territorial Supreme Court opened this morning all the judges were in attendance. The court was presided over by Judge John A. Allen, and Judge Frank Allen, the respondents, the original action was commenced in the First District Court at Ogden by James Allen and Martin A. Allen, his wife, against the defendants, to obtain the cancellation of a deed by the latter to Frank J. Cannon, and another deed by him to Mrs. Florence Nelson. Since the appeal was entered the suit had been dismissed as to Mrs. Allen's motion of her attorney. The court now found no error in the record sufficient to require a reversal of the ruling appealed from, and affirmed the judgment of the court below. Justices Anderson and Blackwell concurred.

An action was brought in the Supreme Court of the United States, the bond being fixed at \$500.

RESTITUTED.

The case of Gothic-Pitts Drug Company, respondent, vs. José G. Allen (Frank J. Cannon & Co.) was reinstated on the docket.

AN ARREST FROM WICHITA.

The case of James Pratt, plaintiff, vs. H. C. Gilbert and C. H. Noland, defendants, was then called on for argument. It is really an appeal from the Court of Appeals, and the cause, the case having been subsequently carried to Judge Mills' court.

John C. Thompson, C. W. Davis, and others against C. W. Davis, to recover damages for services performed in the building business on Park South street, to remove H. C. Miller and his wife, and to quiet title to the premises sold and delivered to the defendants.

GENERAL TERMS.

The import of Justice Bachar, recommending that the compensation of Receiver Lawrence and his attorney be fixed at \$1,000 a month, a sum equivalent to \$1,000, from January 12, 1891, until December 31, 1891, has been approved by the Supreme Court.

In the case of Wm. S. Peacock et al. against the State of Utah, the restraining order, and the restraining order, was granted to the state for the sake of property.

In the case of Detective John Gleason vs. A. A. Smith, defendant, he has been granted a injunction to favor of the plaintiff, awarding \$1,000, with costs, required to pay the costs. The defendant is a Montana resident, and is now in the custody of the Third District court, serving for divorce from his wife and also seeking for the custody of his three children. He had employed Gleason as a lawyer in the case, and the same was done in this city. Gleason was seventeen days on the case. When he presented himself, Smith represented him, and he was retained by him, professing to work in his behalf, having gone over to Mrs. Smith's side. After commentary and many evidences filed, the cause was given the magistrate, as above stated, found for the defendant.
