B. Y. A. Summer School.
Provo, July 23, 1904. — Summer school opened with singing "Oath, Queen of the West." Prayer by Frank Olsen of Fillmore.

It was put to vote by Prof. Clark that the motion to hold school on Pioneer Day should be reconsidered, as a general celebration had been arranged for by the citizens of Provo. Speeches were made by both speakers and members of the faculty and it was finally decided that Pioneer Day would be celebrated by the participants of the B. Y. A. summer school.

SCHOOL OF MUSIC.
This department is under the direction of Prof. H. E. Olsen, assisted by Prof. John J. McCallister Jr., late of Ann Arbor, Mich., who teaches piano, organ, harmony, and counterpoint. Mrs. Edith Johnson, late of Cincinnati, Ohio, is said to have the two methods of voice culture in the West. Miss Edith Johnson has been ill, but has so far recovered that she will be able to take her place in the corps of teachers of this department about August 1st. Prof. Olsen has organized a large class in vocal music that includes nearly all the teachers. There are classes also in piano taking advanced piano, and all other departments are well patronized. Besides the personal desire of many to have this musical knowledge as an accomplishment, there is a growing desire, which is yet to be touched, for a demand for teachers in the district schools who have a little musical knowledge. One application recently received by the principal reads thus: "If you can do so well as we do, will you please come to our school, as we are a teacher who can lead in singing and play accompaniments on the organ and piano." This shows the tendency toward introducing music into the district schools and the teachers are preparing themselves for it. There are some facts about music that are not so well understood as they should be. First, it is a very fine help in skillful hands in controlling character and emotions, and is one of the direct avenues through which a child's mental and spiritual nature can be reached; it occupies the same place in the country of strength and direction of mind for the body, and is indispensable in good school work.

CHILD STUDY.
Many of the most advanced thinkers believe that along this line will be the future educational development. The nearer the teacher and book-keeper approach to their outside to nature's instincts, the fewer educated mentalities will be produced. The teacher in possession of the genius of the senses—seeing, hearing, feeling, smelling, and touching, the genius of the emotions, and the genius of development of the will can work in the light. It is proposed at the close of the summer school to organize an extension of carrying on the study of the nature of a child's nature on this subject.
