Sank in Mid-Ocean. FARTHER POINT, Quebec, 7. — The steamship Titania from Glasgow, pass-ed inward this morning. She has on board 24 of the crew of the steamship State of Florida, that vessel having been sunk by collision with a bark in mid-ocean. Out of 167 persons on the State of Florida, only 44 were saved, and of the bark's crew only the cap-tain and two men were rescued. One hundred and twenty-three souis went down with the steamer and 13 with the bark, making a total loss of 135. The survivors will probably be landed at Quebec.
