BY TELEGRAPH.

WASHINGTON, 5. - The following changes were made in the membership of Senate committees: The Judiciary, Bayard, McGill and Miller, of California; added, Dolph retired; agriculture and forestry, Sawyer and Gibson added; commerce, Dolph, Gorman and Slater added; Farley retired; manufactures, Pike and Butler added; mines and metallurgy, Bowen resigned as chairman; ship and navy, Colton and Jones, of Florida, added; woman suffrage, Cockerill added and made chairman; Missouri, Florida, retired; claims, Fair added; Gibson retired. The following were named as members of the two new committees created, on a new code of Senate rules, and on expenditures of public money: Wilson, Harrison, Plumb, Platt, Beck, Gibson, Kenyon, fish and fisheries, Lapham, Sewall, Davis, Palmer, Morgan, Groome, Farley.

ILLS introduced by Fair, for the settlement of the Judge of the United States District Court for Nevada, \$2,000. Haverly offered a resolution, which was agreed to, directing the committee on printing to inquire into the expediency of publishing an official gazette of the United States, to contain advertisements for proposals for contracts, and other notices and announcements by the heads of the Executive Departments, the more important appointments, and such other notices as are published by the different branches of the government as advertisements in the reports of said committee, at the expense of the present methods of publishing such information be given in detail.

Senator Fair introduced a joint resolution for an appropriation for a sufficient sum to remove the remains of soldiers buried at Fort Churchill to the soldiers' cemetery at Carson City, Nevada, called up the bill, and by him some days ago from the committee on the subject. It provides for a further period of five years that section of the Revised Statutes which prohibits the taking of guano, except for use in the United States, from the islands under the protection of the United States. After debate the bill passed.

Senator Fair reported a bill recently reported by him from the committee on commerce providing for the issue of circulating notes to the National bank associations, be made the special order for Wednesday. The Senate resumed consideration of unfinished business, being on the method provided by a bill reported from the committee on private land claims for settling the same. The bill provided for the United States from Mexico. An extended debate ensued. Amendments by Fernald and Conger were voted down. Without action the Senate went into executive session.

Young, chairman of the committee on expenditures by the Interior Department, reported a resolution authorizing that committee to investigate the condition of the work of the Indian Creek, to send a sub-committee of five members to the Hot Springs to pursue the investigation, and appropriate \$15,000 to that purpose. White of Kentucky, opposed the resolution on the ground that the money should be used for an expedition, a statement emphatically denied by Young.

Dorshelmer, from the committee on justice, reported a bill to amend copyright to citizens of foreign countries. House calendar. Broadly, from the same committee, reported adversely a joint resolution proposing a constitutional amendment to elect representatives to the States, collectors and United States district attorneys. Tabled.

Fernald, from the committee on public lands, reported a bill donating a part of the abandoned Fort Smith military reservation to the town of Fort Smith for school purposes. Referred to the committee of the whole.

Forkins, from the committee on Indian affairs, reported a bill granting the right of way through the Indian Territory to the Kansas and Oklahoma Territory. Referred to the committee of the whole.

Yanson, from the committee on public lands, reported the Senate bill repealing section one of the act granting land to all the construction of the Iron Mountain railway from Pilot Knob to Helena. House calendar.

Hardeman, from the committee on Territories, reported adversely the bill for the election of Territorial governors and Secretaries by the people of the Territories. Tabled.

A bill for erecting a public building at Fort Smith, cost \$100,000, was reported to the committee of the whole.

Curran, chairman of the committee on foreign affairs, reported back the resolution calling on the President for information as to the arrest of B. J. Lewis and other American citizens Jan. 4, 1883, by the Columbian Government. Adopted.

Grove, of Indiana, introduced a bill to prohibit lotteries, lottery advertisements, and the sale of lottery tickets in the Territories. Referred.

Hills reported favorably from committee and placed on calendar. Authorizing the erection of a public building at San Francisco. The bill authorized the Secretary of the Treasury to examine certain vouchers and claims said to be due Missouri by the United States.

AMERICAN. Serious Flooding Along the Ohio and its Tributaries. Mid Wade Captured and Lynched by Vigilantes. Red Handed Road Agents - A Volley Fired into the Atlantic Stage.

The Floods. PITTSBURGH, 5. - Warm rain has been falling almost steadily since Monday, and from indications at 11 to-night the Pittsburgh and Allegheny are on the eve of one of the greatest freshets of the season. The Monongahela and Allegheny rivers are rising 10 inches per hour.

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At Louisville, 5. - It has been raining nearly all day. The river is now 10 inches an hour. At this rate the water will be in houses on the highest part of the city by morning. Anticipating the flood, many residents are moving from the city into higher ground.

At Cincinnati, 5. - With slight intermission it has been raining up to 11 o'clock this morning. The river continues to rise at an alarming rate. It now stands 10 inches a day. It is expected to reach its height in a few days.

TRUTH AND LIBERTY.

A treaty of commerce and friendship has been signed with Corea. It is the first treaty of the kind ever concluded with that country. It is a treaty of friendship and commerce, and is a great step towards the civilization of that country.

St. Paul, Minn., 5. - In an interview with the editor of the "Northern Pacific" the reporter stated that the branches cost \$400,000 per mile, and that the cost of the road would be \$1,000,000 per mile. He denied the charge that the road would be a financial failure.

Washington, 5. - Secretary Chandler has received a cablegram from Lieutenant Harter, in charge of the "Albatross," reporting that the vessel would sail for New York to-morrow in the Frisco.

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FOREIGN.
