LOCAL BRIEFS.

Church Services Earlier—With the coming of October, the city churches are changing the hours of evening service to 8 o'clock earlier.

Winter Office Hours—Beginning today and continuing to July 1, 1931, the United States land office, this city, will be open for business until 4:30 o'clock Saturdays.

Building Ogden Plant—Contractor T. J. Moran began work today on the erection of the new powerhouse for the Utah Light & Railway in Weber canyon, to cost over \$500,000. This will give the company \$500 additional horse power.

Church Building Plans—The Baptists are to sell First South today the property owned by them and apply the proceeds toward erecting the new church edifice in east Second South street. The building can be enclosed with the Sunday school section finished for \$25,000.

Business Men's Recreation—The Y. M. C. A. gymnasium will be open to members of the business men's classes Monday, Wednesday and Friday nights, and on the afternoons of Monday and Wednesday from 5 to 6 p. m., under the direction of Physical Director Oscar B. Gingsch.

More Coal Land Bought—William Schrenker, of Walker, Kansas, and Harry Wood, of Ellsworth, Kansas, paid over today to the United States land office of this city \$2,400 for coal lands on Miller Creek, Carbon county. Each of the above named paid \$15.56 acres of land.

To Attend Convention—General Manager Joseph S. Wells, Assistant Manager R. E. Hunt, Master Mechanic E. E. Franklin, Roadmaster Alex. Brown, and Line Superintendent W. M. Scott of the Utah Light & Railway company have gone to Denver to attend the national convention to be held there, Oct. 5-8, of the National Street Railway association.

Noted Barister—To Lecture—Henry Lanchford, M. A., a well known English barister, is to lecture tomorrow evening, in the First Congregational church on "Life in the Temple; or English Lawyers and Men of Letters at Work and Play." The lecture will cover the literary periods that have made England famous in the realm of literature.

Sleep in Good Condition—State Veterinarian A. C. Young states that of 22,000 sheep in the Heber-Wasatch country that he has examined, he found no traces of the leg and lip disease. Conditions there are gratifying. However, in consequence of reports, Utah sheep have been held up in the east for quarantine, entailing considerable loss on owners.

Sliver City Very "Wet"—Silver City, N. M., county has more saloons for its population than any other city or town in the state. There are eleven saloons and only 700 people to support them. Mammoth, N. M., county, has a population of 300 and only five saloons. The number of saloons in each place where saloons are being conducted is being controlled by H. T. Haines, state stationer.

Fees of City Court—The monthly report of the city criminal court for September which was filed this morning in the city recorder's office shows that the receipts amounted to \$208.90. The state cases in the court from which the city recorder has received revenue amounted to \$322.25. The fines in the court amounted to \$226.90; the forfeitures, \$272; fines for battery, \$109.90; fines for drunkenness, \$147; fines for violation of the city pure food law, \$50. In the civil division of the city court the fees amounted to \$658.24. There were twenty-two suits for delinquent poll tax which netted \$44.

INSTANTLY KILLED UNDER STREET CAR

John Miller, While Sick, Falls Across Tracks—Signal to Motorman Without Avail.

A frightful accident occurred at 11:30 last night at Fifth South and Eleventh East street in which John Miller, 346 Eleventh street, was instantly killed and his body terribly mangled by Mr. Oliver car No. 419. The top of Miller's head was torn off, the left leg crushed and there were many cuts and bruises about the body.

The unfortunate man was walking between the car tracks and was apparently sick. Evidently he had leaned against one of the poles and fell across the track just as the car came down the steep grade. Motorman G. Patterson did not see the body until the car was within 10 feet of the victim and then it was too late to stop.

The accident was witnessed by F. W. Champney, of 1134 east Fourth South street, and A. G. Meyerhoffer, of 425 Eleventh East street. Mr. Champney noticed Miller walking along the street and at the time thought the man was sick. Meeting Meyerhoffer he suggested that the two go to Miller's assistance. When the car came down the grade, Champney cried out to the motorman, but it was too late. Speaking of the accident this morning Mr. Champney said:

"I had just left the car bound for the cemetery and was on my way home. I thought I saw Miller coming toward the tracks when I left the car. He acted as if he was sick. On my way home I stopped to talk to A. G. Meyerhoffer at 425 Eleventh East street. I told him I thought Miller was sick and that we had better go back and see. When we got near the tracks we saw his body lying between them. We shouted at the motorman, but the car was too near to stop. Miller had evidently stopped to lean against one of the telegraph poles and had fallen between the tracks."

Miller was the sole support of his widowed mother. He leaves a sister, Mrs. Earl Wilson, residing in this city, and a brother in San Francisco. The body was removed to Evans' undertaking parlors.
