

six miles west of this point, near Deep Creek Station, and under the direction of Mr. Peter Worthington (our guide) strike for the Goshute Pass. We will back again, making a connection with another line run by Capt. Hodge and his party; after which we will go on location. The only inconventence we have as yet had to meet is owing to the scarcity of water. We have had to carry it in barrels for our stock and in d canteeus for ourselves. The country is one vast desert for nearly sixty miles, and nothing but our inferior quality of salt, and sulphur water within that distance. At Deep Creek we will have a change as there are a few fauches on the route we propose taking from that with some success, I understand, and have laid out a town there.
