

THE WANDERING JEW.

VARIOUS VIEWS FROM THE PESARHUS.
LATENT ANARCHISTS.

The legend of the Wandering Jew, of which several have heard tell of, which most persons know in Hills, is not found either in the apocryphal evangelists or in the Latin fathers of the church, nor in the New Testament. According to the best authorities, it originated at Constantinople. There are two versions—the first is that the Jew is called Bartholomew, and that of Europe which is called Asmodeus. In the Eastern Church he is represented as a porter of Pontius Pilate; in the West as a cobbler living on the slope of Mount Calvary, whose dons Christ passed bearing his cross to the place of crucifixion.

The following reasons for using the name are given by the Wisconsin apocryphal canon:

First—He lives under the temperature of 12° below the surface from 1 deg. to 8 deg. Fahrenheit warmer than similar unshaded ground in the same locality, and at three miles 1 deg. to 8 deg. warmer.

Second—Hollow land by braving the sun loses its power of drawing moisture to the soil from below, and this influence has been long known to extend to a depth of three feet.

Third—The evaporation of rain is more rapid from unshaded ground, unless the surface soil is very wet, and then the reverse is true, and the drying.

Fourth—in cases of frequent flooding, germination is more rapid and complete on raised than on unraised. It was 22 days earlier, however, on raised ground in dry weather, than on unraised, and reached about two weeks earlier than the most shaded.
