INGOT ATTRACTS ATTENTION AGAIN.

Important Find in Uprise One Hundred Thirty Two in Con Mercur Mine.

NEAR THE INGOT SIDE LINE.

Chances Good for Latter Develop. into a Mine—Ore for 40 Feet.

After a silence of many months, Ingot is displaying activity. Last week some trading was done in this stock, and upon investigation it was found that the orders came from Mercur. On Saturday afternoon one brokerage firm filled an order for \$10,000 shares at 2 cents, and during the forenoon call to day, another order for the same amount of shares sold at prices ranging from 24 to 30 cents a share.

A telephone message from Mercur early in the day conveyed the information that the buying was due to late developments in raise 132 in the Consolidated Mercur mine, not far from the Ingot side lines. In this case, it was stated, some important developments were made last week.

THE TRUST HAS ALMOST COMPLETE CONTROL OF MARKET.

The annual review number of the Engineering and Mining Journal which recently a large ore has been disclosed for a distance of 40 feet and assays show values of from \$16 to \$24 in the base and \$9 in gold and silver in the oxidized ores. Nothing, it was said, short of a miracle can prevent this going into the Ingot ground. In the past Ingot has displayed much encouragement from time to time, but developments there failed to encounter ore that could be considered of commercial value.

When Manager G. H. Dern was in the city last week he knew that raise No. 132, which is within the domain of the original Mercur company, was showing a decided change for the better, but did not release any information beyond the official family for fear that it would not pan out.

Developments since have disclosed the fact that the discovery is important, and will be the source, in all probability, of considerable revenue to the Consolidated Mercur, and may also result in making a mine out of the Ingot.

FORENOON ON CHANGE.

Daly-Judge Outed Higher—Closing Quotations and Sale.

On the floor of the mining exchange this forenoon, a total of 22,950 shares were transferred, for which the investor paid \$4,628.62. No stock on the board attracted quite as much attention as Ingot did, which has awakened from a long sleep for a spot of activity.

This was the most important day for Daly-Judge, but the blidders could not bring out a single share, although \$5.75 was bid for it. One broker offered the stock at \$2.25.

May Day continued in the weak condition in which it was left on Saturday. New York, starting at 42 cents, stiffened a few points. Wahash, its neighbor, which had kept up a steady guessing with its series of fluctuations, closed slightly lower. Nodidriver came out at 40 cents. Victoria sold at 26.
