

FORTY-NINTH YEAR. SUICIDE WITH A SHOT GUN. A LITTLE GIRL'S HAPLESS FATE.

Brigham City Man Ends His Life in a Tragic Manner. Three-Year-Old Veta Morgan Killed by a Horse.

BLEW SIDE OF HIS HEAD OFF. CRUSHED BY ITS WEIGHT.

Had "Queer Notions" for a Long Time—But Also Been Refreshing Family Troubles.

Brigham City, April 10.—A ghastly discovery was made here this morning when Brigham Dodge was found dead in a room in his own house, with the right side of his head completely blown off.

The deed was clearly a case of suicide as was evidenced by the deceased still having within his grasp a shot gun, the barrel of which was pointed at the wall against the wall where it had been fired for a short time before the trigger was pulled, leaving a hole in the wall of a shot, which lay near by. The last time Dodge was seen alive was yesterday morning at 10 o'clock. His wife, Mrs. Veta Morgan, told that she had seen him in the morning and that he had been drinking a good deal of late. He had also been in the habit of being out late at night, and it was thought that he had been drinking and was in a bad state of mind.

A jury was impaneled this morning by Justice of the Peace, and the case was set for trial at 10 o'clock. The jury returned at 10 o'clock and found the verdict of suicide. The case was then adjourned until 10 o'clock.
