LOCAL BRIEFS.

Exams in Eighth Grade.—Examinations are in progress for promotions in the eighth grade of the public schools.

Quartermen Get Increase.—Twenty-five quartermen operating at the Bannock stock quarry struck the other day for an increase of wages from \$2.25 to \$2.50 and reduction of hours of labor from nine to eight hours. They were granted yesterday \$2.50 for eight and a half hours' labor, and then the strikers returned to work.

Will Initiate 75 Candidates.—The Knights of Columbus will initiate 75 candidates tomorrow, into the first three degrees of the order. The candidates are coming from Idaho, Nevada and from various sections of this state.
