WEATHER REPORT.

Record at the local office of the weather bureau for the 24 hour, ending at 6 a. m. today:

Barometer reading at 6 a. m., 25.317 inches. Temperature at 6 a. m., 51 degrees; maximum, 59; minimum, 48; mean, 54; which is 17 degrees above normal.

Total excess of the daily mean temperature since the first of the month, 90 degrees.

Excess of daily mean temperature since Jan. 1, 23 degrees.

Precipitation since the first of the month, 1.49 inch, which is .30 inch above the normal.

Accumulated excess in precipitation since Jan. 1, .32 inch.

WEATHER CONDITIONS.

The barometer is highest over the south Pacific states and lake region; and lowest over the middle and northern Rocky Mountain slope and British Northwest Territories.

Precipitation occurred principally over portions of the Pacific states, northern plateau, northern Rocky Mountain slope, Illinois, Nebraska, and British Columbia, with heavy rainfall in Oregon. It was snowing this morning at Pocatello and Boise, and raining at Roseburg. The temperature fell 10 to 21 degrees over portions of Idaho, Nevada and Texas; and rose 10 to 50 degrees over portions of the middle and northern Rocky Mountain slope, upper Mississippi and Missouri valleys. Moderate temperature prevails in all districts.
