

MINING, BUSINESS AND STOCKS

SMELTERS MAY WANT LEAD ORE

Shut-Down at Park City and Elsewhere May Create Early Shortage.

SHIPMENTS AT A LOW EBB

With Mines Down Surplus Will Soon Be Used Up—The Heinze Smelter.

With Park City, Stockton and Ophir closed down tight; Tintic's production cut more than one-half, it is reasonable to presume that the smelting companies will soon begin to complain of an ore shortage, and that they will shortly make overtures to the producers to open their mines and resume shipments again. The fact is, the managers of the two lead smelters in this valley already see signs of an approaching ore famine unless higher prices for the metals prevail in the very near future.

While there has been no organized effort on the part of producers to cut off or stop production entirely; there seems to be a good deal of unanimity of opinion that it is to their interest to cut off the lead-silver ore supply for a few weeks or months.

One prominent smelter official said today he had never seen such a falling off in shipments as has been experienced during the past two weeks. Now that Park City has quit, that Stockton and Ophir have withdrawn from the market several Tintic mines have ceased production and others have cut it to a minimum, it begins to look to me like the smelters will have a hard time getting the furnaces going again. The surplus now on hand is considerable. The producers don't want to ship on this metal market and no one can blame them. If this thing keeps up, of course, it is sure to result in higher prices and that seems to be what the producers are resolved on waiting for."

But these new long term contracts which the smelting companies are trying to get signed up are unprofitable and several of the Tintic operators vehemently make the declaration that they will not tie themselves up now—that they will wait awhile at least. There was considerable significance about the statement made by former Senator Thomas Kearns at the Commercial club banquet on Saturday night. He declared that work could be started on an independent smelter for Utah within the next 30 days. While he did not say so, it goes without saying that Mr. Kearns referred to the Heinze project, plans for which were outlined some time ago.

ON MINING EXCHANGE.

Lower Mammoth Slightly Higher-Closing Quotations and Sales.

The week opened with little encouragement offered by the mining and stock market. The trading was done largely in the Tintic stocks and with the possible exception of one or two of the stocks called, lower prices prevailed. Lower Mammoth displayed a slight tendency to react to the better; while Uncle Sam consolidated, May Day and Colorado acted to the contrary. Seven Troughs also reacted to the better.
