

COMING TOUR OF THE PRESIDENT

Will Leave Washington on the First of April.

EACH SALT LAKE MAY 29.

Will Arrive Home June 4—During His Trip He Will Make Many Speeches.

Washington, March 16.—Several senators and members of the house of representatives from western states had conferences with President Roosevelt concerning his approaching tour of the west and northwest. Dates of the president's visits to cities of several states to be included in his tour were discussed. A few changes were made, but the itinerary of the president's tour has been completed, with the exception of the departure of the president from a few places. The itinerary now rests in the hands of the railroads for determination of the running of the president's train.

LEAVES CAPITAL APRIL 1.

The party will leave Washington on the morning of April 1, and will proceed directly via the Pennsylvania railroad to Philadelphia, arriving there the next morning. April 2, will be spent in Philadelphia, but a program for the president's entertainment there has not been completed.

From Chicago the president will go to Madison, Wis., where, on the morning of the 3rd, he will address the legislature in the state house. Thence he will go to Wausau, Wis., and then to Milwaukee. He will be entertained at the Merchants and Manufacturers' association of Milwaukee the next morning after a two hours' stop at St. Paul, and thence to Minneapolis, leaving the latter city late

On the morning of the 25th, he will reach Fargo, N. D., and during that day will visit Jamestown, Bismarck and Medora, all in North Dakota.

THROUGH THE YELLOWSTONE.

He will visit Livingston, Mont., on Wednesday, April 8, and will arrive at Cinnabar, Mont., at noon of that day. Cinnabar is at the entrance to the Yellowstone park. The president's train will be sidetracked there until Friday, April 24. President Roosevelt will accompany the president's train, accompanied by Senators Sherman and John Burroughs, the poet laureate of New York, who has been invited to accompany the party on the trip, will make an extended tour of the Yellowstone National park under the guidance of Maj. Pitcher, the park superintendent. On this trip, the president will be escorted by a picked detail of soldiers. It is understood that Secretary Loeb and the other members of the president's party will remain on the train at Cinnabar during the president's absence, but communication will be maintained with the president daily during his absence.

On Friday, April 24, the president will leave Cinnabar, and after passing through Livingston, Mont., and Billings, will arrive at Alliance, Neb., late in the afternoon of April 25. After a short stop there, he will proceed to Grand Island, Neb., where the party will spend Sunday. During Monday, April 27, the president will visit in the order named, Hastings, Lincoln, Fremont and Omaha.

IN IOWA.

He will spend the night at Omaha, and will reach Shemandoah, Ia., early on the morning of the 25th. During that day he will make brief stops at Clarinda, Van Wert, Osceola, Des Moines, Okla., all in Iowa. Passing the night on the train, the president will arrive at Keokuk, Ia., on the morning of the 26th.

On the 26th he will visit Quincy, Ill.; Hannibal, Mo.; Louisiana, Mo., and Clarksville, Mo. He will arrive in St. Louis late in the afternoon. That night and April 3 the president will remain in St. Louis participating in the ceremonies incident to the dedication of the Louisiana Purchase exposition grounds. He will arrive at Kansas City on the morning of May 1, and will remain there several hours, visiting Kansas City, Kan.; Lawrence, Kan.; and Topeka the same day. The night will be spent at Topeka.

He will make brief stops the next day at Manhattan, Junction City, Abilene, Salina, Ellsworth, Russell, Hays and Wakeney, and arrive at Sharon Springs, Kan., late in the evening. Sunday will be spent at that place.

COLORADO AND NEW MEXICO.

On Monday, the 4th he will visit Cheyenne, Wells, Denver, Colorado Springs, Pueblo and Trinidad, all in Colorado. He will be in Santa Fe and Albuquerque on Tuesday, May 5. The greater part of May 6 will be spent at Grand Canyon, Ariz.

IN THE GOLDEN STATE.

After a brief stop at Seligman, Ariz., on the night of May 6, the president will proceed to Barstow, Cal., arriving

there the morning of May 7. Redlands and San Bernardino, Cal., will be visited, and he will arrive at Riverside late that day and will spend the night there. On May 8 he will stop at Claremont and Pasadena, Cal., reaching Los Angeles early in the afternoon, where he will remain until the next morning. On May 9 he will visit Ventura, Santa Barbara and San Luis Obispo.

Sunday, May 10, will be spent at Monterey, Cal.; Pajaro, Santa Cruz and San Jose will be visited on Monday, May 11, that night being spent at the last named city. During the morning of May 12 the president will stop at Palo Alto and Burlingame, and will arrive at San Francisco early in the afternoon. The remainder of that day and Wednesday and Thursday, May 13 and 14, will be spent in San Francisco.

IN BIG-TREE REGION.

The president and party will then go to Raymond, Cal., where four days will be spent in the Yosemite valley and big tree region. On the morning of Tuesday, May 15, the president will visit Nevada, stopping at Reno and Carson.

That evening he will return to California for a few days, stopping in Sacramento. On Wednesday, May 20, he will be at Redding and Sisson, Cal., and at Ashland, Or. Thursday morning, May 21, he will spend at Salem, Or., reaching Portland early that afternoon, where he will remain until the next morning.

From Portland the president will go to Washington, stopping at Chehalis, Centralia, Olympia and Tacoma. At Tacoma the president and the entire party will take a boat trip Saturday, May 22, on Puget sound, reaching Bremerton and Everett that afternoon. The special train will be run empty from Tacoma to Seattle.

Sunday, May 24, will be passed in Seattle. Other Washington cities will be visited on May 25, and in this order, Ellensburg, North Yakima, Pasco, Wallula and Walla Walla. Early on the morning of May 26, the president will arrive at Spokane, remaining there for several hours. During that day he will stop at Tokoa, Wash.; Harrison and Wallace, Ida.

In the morning he will reach Helena, Mont., and during the day he will visit Butte. He will arrive in Idaho on Thursday, May 28, stopping at Pocatello, Boise, Nampa, Mountain Home and Shoshone.

IN SALT LAKE MAY 29.

Early on Friday, May 23, he will reach Salt Lake City, Utah, remaining there several hours. During the afternoon and evening he will be at Ogden and Evanston, Wyo.

Saturday morning, May 30, Laramie, Wyo., will be reached. At this point the president will leave the train. He will spend May 31 in a manner suitable to Memorial day, and will rejoin his train at Cheyenne, Sunday, May 31, will be passed at Cheyenne.

On Monday, June 1, the trip homeward to Washington will begin. The only stop that day will be at North Platte, Neb. The president will enter the train on the morning of June 2, touching at Council Bluffs, Denison, Fort Dodge, Cedar Falls and Dubuque. At the last named place he will spend the night. The next morning he will make brief stops at Freeport, Rockford, Rochelle, Aurora, Joliet, Pontiac, Lexington and Bloomington, all in Illinois. The night of June 3 will be spent at Bloomington.

REACHES HOME JUNE 4.

On June 4, he will visit Lincoln, Ill.; Springfield, Ill.; and Decatur, Ill., and will arrive in Indianapolis that night. Thence he will proceed directly to Washington, making only necessary stops, and arriving here on the evening of Friday, June 4.

During the trip the president will make many speeches. A majority of them, quite naturally, will be delivered from the platform of his car, but many of them will be sustained efforts of notable importance.

BURDICK MURDER INQUEST.

Murdered Man's Daughter Was the Main Witness.

Buffalo, N. Y., March 15.—Miss Marion Burdick, the pretty, rosy-cheeked daughter of the late Edwin L. Burdick, was the most interesting witness at the inquest before Judge Murphy today. Marion is 16 years old. She answered in monosyllables whenever it was possible. It was "yes" or "no," or when those replies would not suffice she used as few words as possible. She was not easily confused, and there was no sign of agitation when the district attorney questioned her closely regarding the events that occurred at the time her father was murdered.

Mr. Costerworth began by speaking kindly to the girl and carefully choosing his words in putting questions to her. Later he fired questions in rapid succession. At one time when the district attorney asked the same question several times the girl caused a murmur in the courtroom by raising her voice in a clear, emphatic "I don't know." Nothing of importance was elicited from her while she was on the stand, and the district attorney finally gave her up in despair.

It was all the better for the family to make it out a suicide. Later he agreed with Dr. Rowland that the suicide theory was untenable. The hearing will be continued tomorrow.

Attorneys Sentenced for Contempt

Indianapolis, Ind., March 16.—The attorneys for D. A. Sachs and W. W. Watts, the Louisville attorneys who were sent to the Marion county jail to serve a sentence of 60 days for contempt of the federal court, have filed a bill of exceptions. The bill takes exceptions to much of the testimony that was introduced for the government and to a number of rulings by Judge Anderson. It is understood that an effort is to be made to carry the case to the supreme court of the United States.

Manila, March 16.—William Wilson, former disbursing officer of the bureau of the coast guard and transportation here, who was arrested at Montreal on the charge of embezzling \$8,000 here from Montreal today in custody.

J. A. Teshehman, disbursing officer of the Philippine board of health, who was recently convicted of altering the accounts of the board, arrived here today from Shanghai, from which city he was extradited. The two prisoners were taken to jail.

K. C. Shopmen Are Out.

Kansas City, March 16.—The striking Kansas City Southern shopmen at the various points on that road disregarded the company's ultimatum to return to work today or be considered out of the company's employ and are still out. Work in that department is effectively tied up.

Will Arbitrate Strike.

Toledo, March 17.—At a meeting of the committee representing the teamsters union, the Toledo Cartage association, W. H. Bishop, secretary of the state board of arbitration, Mayor Jones and his secretary, it was agreed to settle the existing teamsters' strike by arbitration.

Dried Peach Pie.

Take either evaporated peaches or apricots; wash them well and soak overnight; then steam until soft in a double boiler. Arrange the pieces in a decorative dish, lined with plain paste, pour the juice over them and sprinkle with sugar. Cross the top with narrow,

twisted strips of paste or with diamond-shaped bits of the paste arranged in a design in the center. Brush with white of egg, sprinkle with sugar and bake in a moderately hot oven until crust is done about 30 minutes.

If the fruit is soft and broken before putting it into the crust.

Apricot Bavarian Cream.

Take one pint-jar of preserved, canned or steamed dried apricots, drain off the syrup and press them through a sieve. If they are not sufficiently sweet, add one-half cup of sugar; then add to this one tablespoonful of gelatine which has been dissolved in cold water, and beat the whole until it begins to thicken—then add one pint of whipped cream, when thoroughly

mixed turn it into a mould and place in a soft custard sauce, or a sauce made from a soft custard sauce, or a sauce made from the syrup which has been drained from the fruit.

Banana Puff.

Take three good-sized bananas and beat to a pulp. Make a meringue by heating the whites of two eggs to a stiff froth, and then adding two tablespoonfuls of powdered sugar. Add to this very gradually the banana pulp, and when all is thoroughly mixed fill little custard cups with the mixture—place in a moderate oven, and when puffed up, which will require about three minutes, remove. Turn out and serve with whipped cream.
