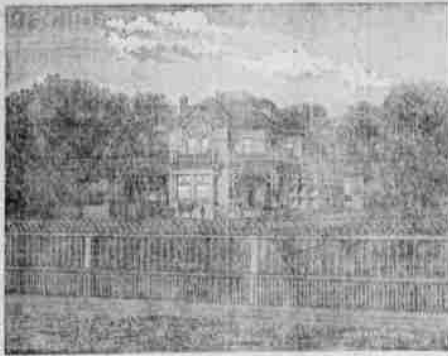




HOME.
