LOCAL BRIEFS.

Boy Has Smallpox—The house of Rev. D. M. Heimlich is under quarantine, as his little son is suffering from smallpox.

Camp Is Quarantined—The construction camp at Garfield where two cases of smallpox is reported, has been quarantined by County Physician Whitney, and no further trouble is anticipated.

Award Is Received—Prof. Stewart received yesterday, the gold medal awarded to the state for the best Normal school display at the Portland fair. It is of gold weighing 3 1/2 ounces and is shield shaped.

Has Had Enough—President J. D. Harris of the State Board of Examiners of barbers has notified Gov. Cutler that he does not desire to be reappointed on the board at the expiration of his present term which is on March 25.

Capital Increased—The Union Cemetery association of North Ogden has filed an amendment to its articles of incorporation in the secretary of state's office by which its capital stock is increased to \$1,500, divided into shares of the par value of \$2 each.

Inspection and Drill—The High school cadets, 250 strong, will be given a special drill and inspection at 2:40 p. m. next Friday at the weather permitting. Capt. Webb has got the young soldiers in fine shape, and a creditable display is promised.

Making Investigation—The county attorney of Davis county has notified the state board of health that the sheriff and one of the county commissioners are investigating the case of the local slaughter house complained of, and will report on the same later to the state board.

Bankruptcy Petition—Clement S. Thompson, a carpenter and builder of this city, has filed a petition in bankruptcy in the United States circuit court. The liabilities are named in the sum of \$2,164.55, and the assets are scheduled at \$336, all of which is claimed to be exempt.

A Narrow Escape—The damage done to the second West street residence of B. B. Owens by lightning during the recent storm, amounted to over \$500. Falling bricks from the partially destroyed gambrel roof landed on the roof of Mr. Owens' father, but he, fortunately, escaped injury.

Will Report Today—A meeting of the state board of education is scheduled for this afternoon at 2 o'clock in the office of State Supt. of Schools Nelson at which a report is expected from the sub-committee appointed to revise the requirements of the board for diplomas and certificates.

Garfield Damaged—Yesterday's storm did considerable damage at Garfield where many of the temporary structures were demolished. The Huck store building and the local postoffice building were wrecked. Nearly all the tents were blown down, and it is estimated that the total losses there will amount of \$5,000.

Sutherland of the United Charities of America, has made an assignment to appoint two men or women as members of the financial board of that institution for this state. The object of the organization is to aid poor, orphaned, and neglected children, and it has a home for such at Eureka Springs, Arkansas.

For Bathing Resort—The Salt Lake Beach company has just bought 100 dozen new bathing suits for the coming season, styles being chosen by bathing at the Pacific coast resorts. The wear and tear of suits at Salt Lake are more than one would readily imagine, for the management reports that at the end of each season the losses from various causes will foot up about 50 dozen suits.

RUSSIAN CONSUL GENERAL IS HERE

Dr. J. M. Crawford Was Formerly in Charge of Affairs in St. Petersburg.

IS SORRY THE JAPS WON OUT.

However He Would Equally Have Regretted if Russia Had Defeated Opponents in Big Struggle.

A special car containing a number of prominent residents of Milwaukee, Minneapolis, Cincinnati, Logansport, West Baden, Ind.; Constantine, Mich., and Eau Claire, Wis., arrived in Salt Lake yesterday afternoon over the Rio Grande from the west. Arrangements were made to give the visitors a ride around the city, and a private organ recital at the Tabernacle, prior to leaving for the east over the Rio Grande in the evening.

One of the most distinguished of the visitors was Dr. J. M. Crawford, late consul general of the United States in Russia. He had charge of all the consular affairs of this country for six years prior to the Roosevelt administration, with offices in St. Petersburg. In the past Crawford had been in the recent troubles in Russia, Dr. Crawford was decidedly loth to discuss the question. On the subject of the recent Jap-Russo war, however, he was not so non-committal.

"I have views on this question," he said, "but I don't care to express them. I may give you in a sentence a summary of my view, while I expressed before the beginning of the war."

"I regret that the Japs were successful in this conflict. I should have regretted equally if Russia had been successful in conquering the Japs. In the first place the success of the Japs will plant their race so firmly in the east that the Anglo-Saxon interests commercially and otherwise will be endangered and the day will come when the United States will see it."

"If Russia had been equally successful with the Japs the same dilemma, the same danger would be presented. The Slavonic interests would then be implanted so firmly in the east as again to endanger Anglo-Saxon interests."

"My belief is therefore that the only correct solution of this question would be through diplomacy, that the Anglo-Saxons should combine and insist that that England and the United States should join hands in this regard, and give Anglo-Saxons a better hold upon the east."

Dr. Crawford, it was learned, was an excellent linguist, and especially thoroughly understood that most difficult of all European languages, the Russian, which he had applied to excellent use during his official residence in that country in compiling volumes dealing with the industrial resources of the country.
