## A SECRET SESSION.

Held by the Disciples of Christ and Dead Jesus in the Federal Court Room last night.

The "Liberals" One hundred and in session, convened in the Federal Court Room last evening. The meeting was strictly secret; all who sought admission without a certificate of good standing in the rule or rank were turned away.

The certificate consisted of cards which were issued to the number of one hundred. But it is asserted on good authority that only a dozen cards were sent, for reasons best known to themselves, failed to respond, and a second indiscriminate issue was ordered to anyone who was "Liberal" inclined.
