

PRESIDENT WANTS A SEA LEVEL CANAL.

And He, in Effect, Tells the Board of Consulting Engineers He Wants it in a Hurry.

MAKES SOME SUGGESTIONS.

They Are to be Understood as Such and Not as Directions—He Urges Expedition.

Sept. 16.—President Roosevelt is making in the strongest terms the necessity for a plan for the construction of the Panama canal which may be accomplished in the shortest possible time.

The president said: "I am about to say what I think ought to be done in the light of suggestion, but not as a direction, I have named you as the committee you are especially fitted to serve as advisers in the greatest engineering work of the world yet seen, and I expect you to advise me not what you think I ought to do, but what you think I ought to do."

There are two or three considerations which I trust you will readily appreciate in coming to a decision as to the proper type of canal. I hope that ultimately it will prove possible to build a sea-level canal. Such a canal which shall provide for the immediate building of a canal on the safest terms and in the shortest possible time, to build a sea-level canal will slightly increase the cost of the canal, but it is not probable that it will be possible to build a canal which will be a compromise between the two, and I expect you to advise me as to the advantages and disadvantages of each.
