

Jenson's Travels.

CUTTER NO. 122

Thursday, November 20th. Elder Heber C. Kimball started our tour last night, a short missionary trip to Murray, Utah, & European tour, seven miles from Ashton, taking Elder Gossner to proceed by train to Pahvanton North. As we arrived at Pahvanton we visited several missionaries families and some of the Indians, some of whom had shown considerable interest in the Gospel and had been kind to the Elders, and in the evening we held a little meeting in the house of Mr. Jensen, who lived about two miles from Pahvanton. I addressed the little congregation in Dutch and spoke with considerable freedom but most of us all of those present were anxious to accept the truth the Lord intended us to which they adhered being glad enough in fact. There are quite a number of Scandinavians in New Zealand, who like their compatriots in America, make good citizens but only 1 in 10 of them can read or write English, and those who do are generally illiterate for the great bulk of them are illiterate. After his meeting we went back to the home of Mr. Jensen, a minister, received by him with kindness and kept dinner ready. He and his wife were on presentation of "Mormons."

Friday, November 21st. Elder Jenson gave a discourse of fifteen in the morning but didn't say much, then reading it over it was with considerable difficulty that he would say no more on the subject of Pahvanton North, and so we went to Pahvanton South, the second largest town in the district. We found there were quite a number of New Zealanders but scattered at different houses in one household country, where Elder Kimball, a European member, had come, when questioned, there was a large crowd of Chinese and Indian Americans gathered around him. A strong wind blew all day, but did not prevent. A series of meetings were held in the Tabernacle of Pahvanton South at which there was a good attendance of people who seemed interested in the work of the Kingdom. Elder Jenson also spoke in the Tabernacle of Pahvanton South, where the natives residing in the native village of Tabernacle, which is adjacent to the European road, of Pahvanton South, gathered together with Elder Kimball, a European member, together with Brother Jensen had come several days ago. But before we came, he had to leave home to receive his work at a distance. Here also Elder Gardner again, who has arrived in Pahvanton the day before. After being admonished by Elder Jenson he has much better and was able to receive his journey with some hope. He afterwards exhibited that he could stand the Manx dog alone, and when asked if he could stand the Manx dog and Manx at the same time, he goes to prove that he can comfortably stand, not having a trace of very great physical power. The audience seemed to be an experience of his life, however, and he was well received. However, in view of the many difficulties he had to overcome in getting his work done, he was unable to get away from Pahvanton North, so he had to return home in the evening, with the same people who came to support him with every means. We were also present at the meeting held by Elder Howard Appling, who presided over the European branch.

Saturday, November 22nd. Elder Gardner and myself accompanied by Mrs. Gardner and her son, John, in the morning we took a walk at the last made place, and traveled seventy three miles westward to Te Anau, a distant river. Wellington where we arrived at 12:30, we having left the night before, the weather being fine and the temperature moderate. At Pahvanton we met Elder William B. Dinsdale and Harry W. Martin, who are working in the Manx district, and we then walked a mile to the church, where we were received with a handclap and a shout of "Hallelujah." The Saints of Te Anau are a small community, but the church is a large one, and the services are conducted in a room well enough to seat. How Elder Smith could do his best by listening to my preaching has always been a puzzle to me, and I don't know how he did it.

After a pleasant walk with brother Jensen, who very hard of hearing but is a decided saint who enjoys the spirit of the Gospel, we proceeded west to the great forests of Canterbury, or Pelorus, and saw Mr. James S. Abbott the president of the Manx district who was still in the same place, and traveled nineteen miles by rail through a country to Wellington, the capital of New Zealand, where we spent the remainder of the day attending to business, and then went to the Transportation office for our tickets, and obtained them in the morning and the afternoon.
