CATERPILLARS IN BOX ELDER CO.

Sugar Beets Growing Rapidly in Utah County—Frigid in Wasatch to Bring Strain Up.

Observer Calligraphy reports as follows for the past week. General review—Since the high wind storm of the 29th of May, which did considerable damage to trees and tender plants, the weather has improved. There was a light shower on the night of June 1st, since then it has been dry and windy—the wind has been as drying that irrigation had to be resorted to and is now becoming general.

Though the days have been bright and sunny, the nights have been too cold for rapid growth, and on the 5th, 6th and 8th there were light frosts in localities, which injured potato tops, potatoes and beets.

The reports are for the most part favorable and hopeful. The prospects are fairly good, though by no means so favorable as last year at this time. Irrigation was longer deferred in the locality of Kanab, Millard county, than it has ever been before. In many localities, the crops have been somewhat injured by Grand county, and are just ripening and being put on the market in Utah county. Caterpillars have made an appearance in Box Elder, where they are doing considerable damage to fruit trees. In Garfield county cattle are now gaining in flesh, and look fine.

Extracts from Correspondents' Reports.

BOX ELDER COUNTY. Near River City—Crops are green and growing slowly, wheat and corn are not so plentiful. Harvesting will be very late, and unless rain falls sufficient in the next fortnight, will be very light on dry land.

K. K. Elder City—Weather still chilly, dry, and rather windy. Crops are doing fairly. The fruit trees are ravaged by caterpillars to an extent unknown for many years.

Logan—Fine weather, crops doing well, though a little somewhat cool. Rich County. Handbell—Crops look not for the want of warm. Lucern has been watered for the first time, and is about eight inches high.

Wash County. Hooper—A terrific windstorm on the evening of the 25th did considerable damage, blowing over trees and uprooting them at different parts of town. Grain crops are doing fairly well, but will be light this season. Haverhill—The last week has been windy and dry, with cold nights. Lucern about a foot high.

Haverhill—A little rain, the temperature has been low, crops grow well under irrigation.

Parow, Iron county—The past week has been very cool, with light frosts at night, some high winds, no precipitation.

Low, Susquehanna county—The past week has been very favorable for all kinds of crops, which now look well, water is plentiful for irrigation. Cattle are gaining in flesh and look well.

Mt. Carmel, Kane county—Last week rather windy. Fruit is not all killed as supposed but will be very light crop.

Diphtheria in Riverton. Riverton, Salt Lake county, June 8.—John Nielsen and wife have had a bad experience in the last year. Some twelve months ago they lost a son about 11 years old; he died of Bright's disease. Last week they lost two of their children, girls, one was about 13 years old and the other about 11. This time it was diphtheria, which got into the family. No one knows how it came but the doctor declared the disease to be of the worst type. The two girls were taken away in the fourth of health. One was in only four days before her death. The other one took sick and died within five days after the first. They were good and intelligent girls.

A brother of the deceased, aged about 24, had just arrived from the B. V. country at 11 o'clock. He has been taken seriously ill with the same disease, and it is a question whether he will survive or not, he is in a very low condition.

Brother Nielsen and wife have the sympathy of all the people in Riverton, so far as can be ascertained the disease has not spread any further as yet, and it is hoped it will not do so.
