COLORADO FIRES DOING GREAT DAMAGE.

Point May suffer from storm—Antelope about the same—April Conference Arrived—The Prime Market.

Denver, Wednesday, Sept. 28. J. F. Hargrave and William Hargrave of Chicago, Ill., each came in today with two cars of cattle.

Two freight trains arrived in a head-on collision at a small station on the Great Northern road at Santa Fe, N. M., Tuesday night. The injured are C. H. Harris and William Hargrave of Chicago, Ill. Harris is said to be recovering. The work will delay traffic for a few days.
