

SALT LAKERS BUY DICK ROCK RANCH

Famous Buffalo Field Will be
Converted Into Capitalists'
Summer Resort.

HOW TWO MEN MADE MONEY.

Let Down the Bars and Drove Wild
Game Into the Enclosure—
Rock's Tragic Ending.

Butte, Mont., Nov. 29.—The Dick Rock ranch at Henry's lake in this state has been sold to Salt Lake City parties and the old landmark will be converted into a summer resort for capitalists who seek the mountains for the hunting season. The ranch was owned by Vic Smith, of Anaconda, and his partner, Dick Rock, in 1885. Smith was in at the death of the race of the buffalo on the plains of Montana and Dakota and at that time became acquainted with Rock, who was probably the fastest man on the plains with a skinning knife, and though nothing of taking the valuable trophy in one day, with no tackle or facilities whatever save his knife and to swift hands backed by brawny arms. With the passing of the buffalo and after the Indian troubles had been settled, the two men found their occupation gone and had to seek new fields.

MEN GREW ENVIROUS.
Smith made a trip west and in the parks and zoos there saw many of the animals he had been accustomed to seeing running wild. He was astonished to learn of the fabulous sum paid by the collectors of game for show prizes and game preserves. Then he conceived the idea of supplying this market and with Rock, he took up the Henry's lake ranch.

BUILT HIGH CORRALLS.
Then they hit upon a more wily plan. High corralles were built during the summer. When winter came they placed wild hay and tempting food in the enclosure and left down the bars on one side. Then Vic and his partner as elk would locate a herd of elk and drive them ahead of them, like cattle, as the animals were unable to make head in the snow. The elk were entered into the traps and the bars put up. Then it was only necessary to feed them until sold. They were shipped to all parts of the country but the best market was found among the wealthy men of New York who stocked their preserves in the Adirondacks from the Rocky mountain ranch. Elk sold for \$5 to \$100 each; mountain sheep \$25, bears \$50, deer \$30 each, and the purchasers paid the freight and bore the expense of getting the animals to the railroad.

REAPED RICH HARVEST.
During their five years of partnership they captured in all 397 elk, 280 deer, 20 mountain goats, 12 bears and a few moose. Last of all they took in three buffalo calves. Then Vic sold out and Rock continued the business alone. The calves grew up. Dick thought they had become reconciled to their life of confinement. One day in an unguarded moment he ventured too near one of the buffalo. It attacked him and gored him to death. The animals were afterwards sold to United States Senator Clark of Montana, and are now pointed out as one of the attractions at Columbia Gardens in Butte.

Japs' Brutality in Korea Worse
Than Repression of the
Spaniard in Cuba.

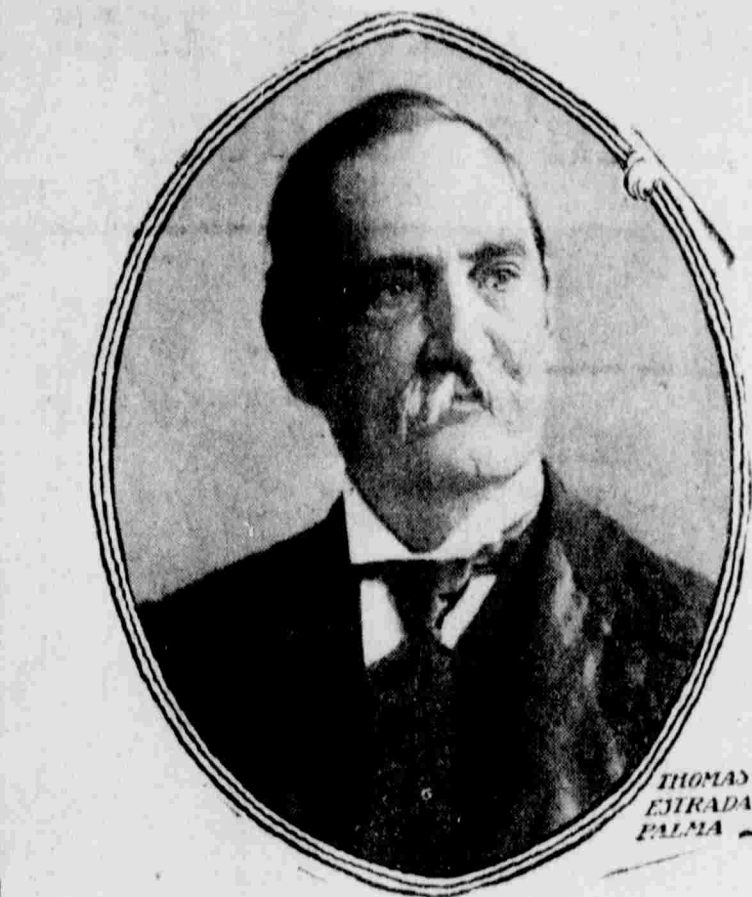
KNOWN TO FOREIGN OFFICE.

Japan's Ulterior Purpose Said to be
One of Absorption of Both
Country and People.

Washington, Nov. 21.—It is known to the department of state to only a few officials of that department, that the conditions of Korea are not only deplorable but pitiful. It is known to our foreign office that the repression of the Spaniard in Cuba is being exceeded by the brutality of the Jap in Korea. The American people have not been taken into the confidence of the department of state, and this publication of the actual conditions is the first declaration made to our people. It will be followed by other declarations with considerable circumstantiality of detail.

No criticism is herein made, nor ever should be made, of the department of state for the secrecy therein maintained concerning our foreign relations. For nearly 10 years the department of state endeavored to secure justice and fair dealing for the people of Cuba, without letting the American people know the deplorable condition existing so near our shores. The time came, however, when the people of this republic ascertained the facts for themselves through their newspapers. After they became aware of the murders, assassinations, starvations and other heinous crimes constantly perpetrated in Cuba, it was found by the government at Washington, by all the corporate interests of this great republic, that the people of the United States could not, and would not, endure or permit to continue these atrocities. Sooner or later the American people shall know all the facts concerning the conditions in Korea. And it is of singular significance that for distant Korea is our neighbor, because we are the only civilized nation near her coast. Just as Russia crushed and oppressed Poland and eliminated the individuality of that people, the Japanese are beginning to destroy the en-

It is believed that the Cuban government fears a coup d'etat, as the number of police at the president's palace has recently been trebled. For the last seven days the policemen have been compelled to sleep on the palace floor.

A plot against the life of General Freyre Andrade, secretary of the interior, was unearthed last week. The would-be assassins, according to the story, intended to waylay the secretary on his farm, but their plans miscarried. The secret police believe there is some ground for the story and are making investigations.

That the Liberal party sees its only hope for victory in a coup d'etat was evidenced by an interview of General Jose Miguel Gomez, leader of the defeated Liberal party, in which the old warrior declared that it was useless for his party to depend on the ballot for victory, as the polls, he asserted, were in charge of the Moderates, the party of President Palma.
