# LUXURIES IMPORTED DURING MONTH OF APRIL

New York, April 4 .- According to the igures of the customs office the luxries imported into this country durng April indicate a return of prosperity. During the month diamonds, pearls and other precious stones aggregating an appraised value of \$2,418,-242 were imported through this port. 242 were imported through this port. This is six times the quantity import-cd during the same month last year and is more by nearly half a mil-lion, than the value of the precious stones imported during April, 1907. In the same month, 172 automobiles of the appraised value of \$315,662 were imported while in April, 1908, thore were only 71 automobiles, valued at \$181,496 brought in. The appraised value of all foreign merchandise entered in this port last month was \$78,725,064, more than any one April in several years and ex-ceeding April 1908, by \$23,000,000.
