

A VISIT TO SALT AIR.

A Pleasant Ride Over the Salt Lake & Los Angeles Road.

A LOT OF SURPRISED CITY SOLONS.

More Than \$200,000 Being Spent in Improvements—Banquet at the Beach.

In response to an invitation from the Salt Lake & Los Angeles railway company a majority of the members of the City Council went out to Sausal yesterday afternoon to inspect the magnitude of the improvements. A special train under the direction of General Manager N. G. Clayton was placed at the disposal of the party. Besides the sons of the grand jury and a number of citizens who accepted the invitation. At 12:30 the above gentlemen left the City Hall at 1:30 on special street cars generously furnished by the city railroad company. The special train provided by the Salt Lake & Los Angeles company, was made up of the entire cars of which were filled with men later the trip to the beach commenced. A stop was made about five miles west of the city to allow an inspection of a piece of realty offered as a site for the proposed new post office. Sausal was selected as the best location and the new post office could be plainly seen across the prairie.

Its magnificient proportions were, however, already realized until the train stopped again after a short ride from Sausal. Then came the excitement of admiration and surprise by the visitors. They had heard and read somewhat the greatest amount of money that was being spent in railroads in the erection of a great post office building, but were still prepared to see something else. "It's amazing what can be done with \$200,000," said one of the councilmen.

The train was abandoned when the visitors reached the beach and the party headed by Manager Clayton and architect Kutting waded out over the approach, a distance of several hundred feet more, to the place where piles are being driven for the pier. The piles had been driven a full and minute distance, and it was announced in the News on January 14 last. About forty men were engaged in pile driving. The principal machinery used was two large engines, each driving a pile driver. The driving will be finished in about ten days more, when a force of 200 to 300 men will be employed on the pavilion and causeways, which, according to contract, must be complete and ready for use on Feb. 15, 1883. Mr. Clayton says he is satisfied with the work.

At the boarding house on shore the visitors were treated to a fine repast as ever was spread on the banquet boards of the Knobbed or Templeton. The trip of fourteen miles was made in seventeen minutes, including a stop.

Manager Clayton was unceasingly anxious to be an excellent entertainer, his brother Louis, secretary and treasurer, an able assistant, the Salt Lake & Los Angeles road a marked success and the great pavilion a large piece of architectural beauty and great good.

A FIVE CENT FARE.

People residing in the newly annexed District Ready to have Cheap Transportation.

There was a mass meeting of citizens in the hall at the corner of Ninth East and Logan avenue last night. Those present were representatives of Park Avenue, Lincoln Park, West Grand View, South Lawn and neighborhood. The occasion which brought them together was a unanimous decision on the street railway companies to adopt a five cent fare schedule for the districts in which they lived.

J. S. Cannon of the Rapid Transit was present and proposed a plan which would give people purchasing houses on the Rapid Transit route to tenth South, warrants to Eleventh South and six cents to Twelfth South. These offers were rejected and a resolution was passed to the effect that the people of the recently annexed districts are entitled to the same privileges as the districts as any other part of the city, and main mining the stand that can charge five cents or five cents only, should be taken as any part of the annexed boundaries.

Resolutions for the appointment of a citizens' committee were also passed for future organization, and the charter was authorized to appoint a committee of three, who will name the same from the street railway companies, the said citizens' committee to be elected for one year.

Copy of the five cent fare resolutions will be sent to the City Council, Salt Lake and Rapid Transit Railway companies.

Mr. Mayr presided at the meeting. Commissioner Horn was one of the speakers and assured the citizens that the council would give due consideration to their demands to be referred.
