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The flat has gone forth that official rogues and rascals must be not only exposed, but punished in every State, and in every municipality, to the end that robbery shall cease to be a passport of either political or social position, and that good morals and good government shall again assert their supremacy against bad moral and bad government, all over this God-forsaken country.

That there is great need of reform in this country in the direction of honesty, truth, and virtue is undeniable, and if the reformation should begin at New York, it may be said it could hardly begin at a place where reformation is more needed.
