Household Pests-How to Deal with Them.

Mr. William Steele is not the only person in the country whose troubles from the eneroschment of insects are sufficient to inspire a wish for the invention of some infernal machine to extirate such pests as sand files, fleas, etc. But it seems to me, that the dissemina-tion of science and a better knewledge of entomelogy are what is most need in this direction. I have not seen a bed-bug or a flea in my house for many years. If an army of them were to be

brought in, mercury would speedily exterminate them, but I think cleanliness the best, and perhaps the only preventive. The commen house fly I do not molest, be-lieving that it more than com-pensates for its trouble, by clear-ing the atmosphere of effluvia and the animalcules which always arise Cloth Embossed, 1.60. As to the loss of fruit by the birds, the latter are always sure to be on

the latter are always sure to be on hand in force in the season of ripe fruit, whether they come early enough to take the worms or not. For the residue of insects which infest my vegetable garden. I find that the laboratory of the chemist furnishes materials fatal behen all, among which, white hellengs and cayenne pepper are of the most utility, the bug or worm which cannot find vegetation unflavored with these articles, will beak its breakfast elsewhere, and lawre my garden unmolested. A few drops of carbolic acid in a rint of water will clean house plants from lice in a very short time. If mosquitoes or other bloodsuckers infest our sleeping rooms at night, we uncork a bottle of the oil of pennyroyal, and these insects leave in great haste, nor will they return as long as the air in the room is loaded the latter are always sure to be on

sathe air in the room is loaded with the fusies of that aromatic herb. If rats enter the cellar, a little powdered potash, thrown into their holes or mixed with meal and scattered in their runways, never falls to drive them away. Cayenne papper will keep the buttery and stereroom free from ants and cockstereroom free from ants and cock-roaches.—Charles Thompson in Sci-entific tries four.
